Janet Sharma's Meeting notes

Budget: The recently passed NJ Budget includes \$7million for Age-Friendly Community Grants and a Caregiver Hub. Breakdown and rollout details are not yet available.

Next steps for New Jersey: Internal team is compiling materials from Council input to form a Blueprint, which will be shared with leadership internally. The Department of Human Services will share the Blueprint with Council members with a Zoom presentation in September or October. There will be an opportunity for feedback but no voting. The Council is Advisory to the DHS, and the Blueprint is to be submitted to the Governor by the DHS. The official Advisory Council work is done.
