## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Over five years ago, I was speaking with Tom Fenner about the history of Meals on Wheels in our community. Many years ago, our church helped launch the first Meals on Wheels program in Washington. Tom then went on to say that it is a shame that there isn't a free Meals on Wheels program that runs on weekends. There are paid programs such as Mercy and the Senior Center, but no free options. Tom felt that this was such a shame because there several elderly, disabled, and poor persons who could really benefit from such a program.

It was at this point in the conversation that I remembered the following words of wisdom: "Mission happens where the strength of the congregation meet the needs of the community."

We have an amazing commercial kitchen that, five years ago, was not being used very often. Around the same period that I had the above conversation with Tom Fenner, the session and I agreed that the kitchen's lack of use was a shame. We also have several people who LOVE to cook in the congregation. Two strengths and one need. Could God have a service opportunity for us? Could a new community mission program be possible?

God began planting a new vision within the Mission Committee and me: an every weekend ministry that delivers free meals to those in need. But, could a small congregation pull off such an endeavor? Would we have the volunteers? Would we have the funding? Would we find the clients? Would other congregations partner with us?

We all had our doubts that this vision would come to fruition. But, God tells us through the words of the Proverbs: "Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established." (16:3) So, the Mission Committee and I committed ourselves to the work.

We launched our first delivery in August of 2017. Using a delivery list primarily compiled of senior center clients, God's vision came into focus. For the first few years, we were only able to deliver once a month. Then slowly, more volunteers came forward from the congregation, Lifestream and Peace Lutheran Churches partnered with us. Grants and generous donations came in. We were able to expand to 2-3 weekends a month!

Then, First United Methodist Church agreed to partner with us as well, and even more people from our own congregation jumped at the chance to serve their community. And, the Mission Committee realized that the vision of an every week free meal delivery ministry was at hand. We had committed to the work and God established our plans.

This month, a five year journey comes to fruition! We will be delivering free meals on the weekends to those in need on EVERY WEEKEND!

The Weekend Meals on Wheels ministry is February's MISSION OF THE MONTH. We will highlight it on our website, social media, Moments for Mission, etc. Each month, a new mission project will be highlighted (from Harvest Table to the Mission Garden).

I am so grateful to the Mission Committee; to the many volunteers who have already cooked, shopped, packed or delivered; to Lifestream, Peace Lutheran, and First United Methodist Churches; to all those who donated funds and resources; and to YOU for all your prayers that God would bless this mission.

God has established our plans and we have committed ourselves to the Lord's work!

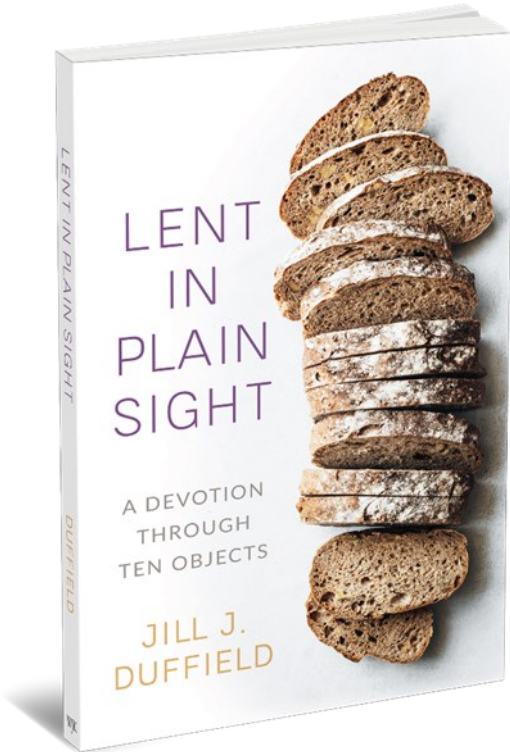
### **New Elders**

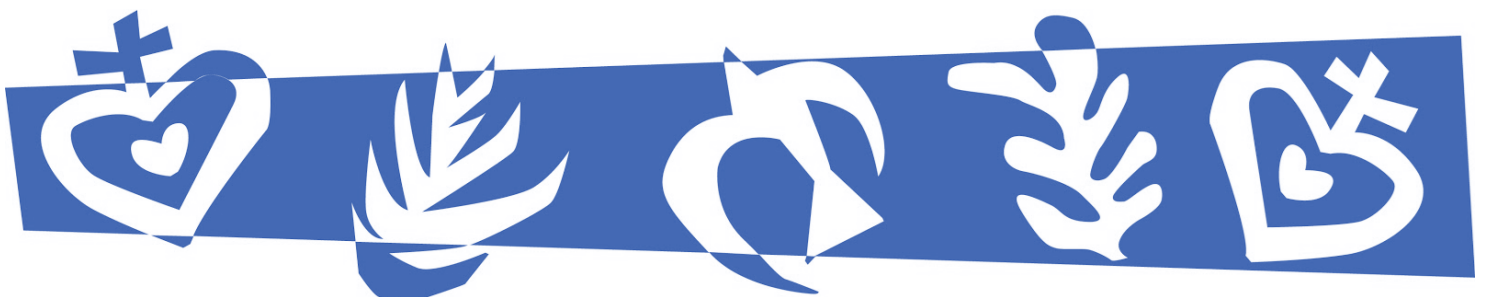

## Anna Mae Boehmer marks 75 years in Presbyterian Church of Washington Choir

When Anna Mae Boehmer started piano lessons as a little girl, her feet could barely reach the instrument's pedals. On Sunday, Dec. 19, those same feet stood near the altar of the Presbyterian Church of Washington, where Boehmer was honored as the church's longest-tenured member of the choir.

"They gave me a plaque and flowers and a lot of hugs. I was floored," Boehmer said. "I was just absolutely got."

Accompanist Emily Bounds said no one else in the group "even comes anywhere close" to Boehmer's number of years of choir membership.

Boehmer, now 86, joined the choir in 1946, when she was 12, and has sung with the group nearly every Sunday for 75 years since. She's spent around 243,000 minutes either practicing or performing with the group, and has been led by several different directors, most recently Aaron Bounds. "She's just a staple," he said of Boehmer.

Boehmer said music has always been part of her life. Growing up, she was drawn to the dark wood upright piano that her mom had received for free from a newspaper listing several decades earlier — Boehmer still has the piano in her basement. She took lessons from Nila Bourne on Main Street, who at the time was the choir director and organist at the Presbyterian Church. "They usually didn't put people in choir until they were 14, but they were very short on sopranos. So she had me sing for her," Boehmer said.



Each week, Boehmer walked from her childhood home about five blocks east of the hospital to the Presbyterian Church, then situated at Fourth and Market streets. She said she quickly felt accepted by the mostly older members of the choir, including one member who was particularly special.

"My dad (Charles Wolking) and I were in the choir together for a while. I guess I kind of took after him," she said. "My dad was a beautiful tenor. Beautiful tenor, and he was a sweetheart."

Boehmer also felt the influence of her family each time the choir was accompanied on the church's organ, which her great-great-aunts had donated before she was born.

Boehmer said the closest she ever came to quitting the choir was around the time she and her late husband, Wilbert, whom she wed at the church in 1955, welcomed son Charles and daughter Denise. Boehmer had told friends Etta "Boots" Bonney and Jeri Brockman that she would have to quit, and both insisted she stay in the group.

"They would take turns watching them, sometimes getting in arguments about who would get to keep the baby," Boehmer said, laughing. "That's how I got to stay in the choir when my kids were little."

As her children got older, Boehmer also led singalongs during Sunday School, which is where accompanist Emily Bounds met her.

Among Boehmer's favorite hymns to sing are "How Great Thou Art," a Swedish hymn originally composed by Carl Boberg and made popular during the Billy Graham crusades; "Amazing Grace," which was written by Englishman John Newton, a former slave trader who became an ardent abolitionist; and "In the Garden," composed by Charles Austin Miles, an American pharmacist who left the industry in the early 1900s and went on to write 400-plus hymns.

"I remember her at the piano, teaching us songs for church," Emily Bounds said. "I'm a music teacher now, and a lot of my early music experiences were with Anna Mae in church."

"She's been very impactful to me, and even more than music, she has just always been a steadfast, loyal person in my life."

Aaron Bounds, who met Boehmer when he started directing the Presbyterian Church choir in January 2019, described Boehmer as "the heartbeat of the church."

"Anna Mae is so much more than the choir. She makes the coffee every Sunday, she makes sure the robes are clean and (sets up) communion. She (handles) all the details," Aaron Bounds said. "She's like a low hum. You always know she's there."

Emily Bounds said she fondly remembers Boehmer's famous ground roast beef for sandwiches that were an essential offering at church meals when Bounds was growing up. Boehmer said she also loves bringing macaroni salad and angel food cake.

For the Bounds family, Boehmer's consistency is evident not only in her dedication to choir but also in her work throughout the church.

"You can tell when Anna Mae looks at you that you are loved," Emily Bounds said. "She's consistent with her love for everyone in the church."

As Boehmer approaches her 90s, she said she can't promise that she'll sing with the choir forever, but she is grateful for the seven-plus decades spent singing.

"Mrs. Bourne would just be pleased as punch if she knew I was still singing," Boehmer said. "But I just enjoy it."

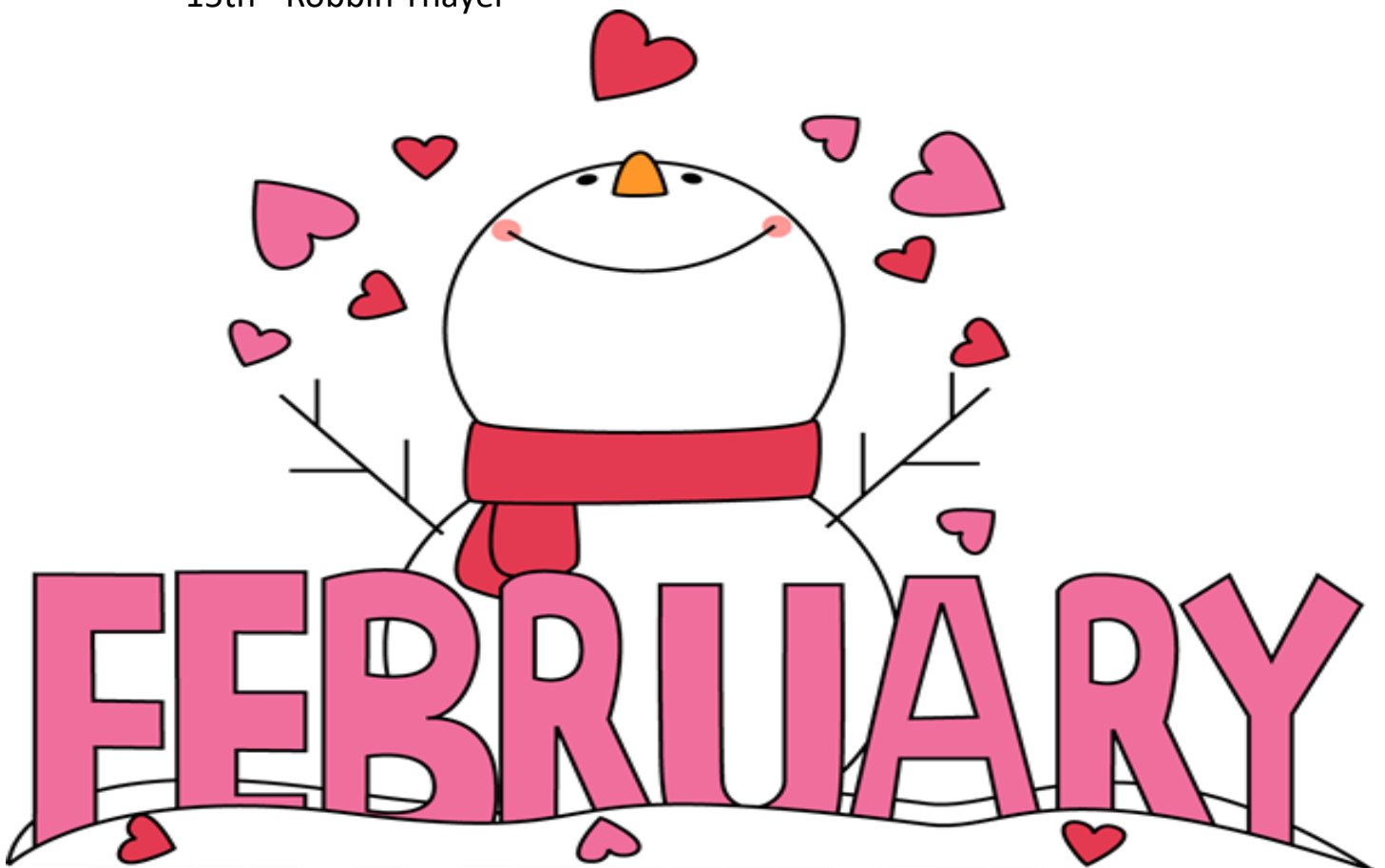
