A director guides the actors through the story. Often, when an actor follows and submits to good direction, their performance excels. In a similar manner, when we follow God's direction, like it says in the above quote from the 37th Psalm, our lives excel. Though we may stumble, we will not fall, because God holds us by the hand.

However, all too often, we see ourselves as the Director, not one of the many actors. We want to run the show. We think we know what the other actors should say or do. We want to dictate the lights, the scenery, even the plot of the story! However, when we expend so much energy trying to control, direct and change things we have no power over, we spin our wheels. Worse than that, we live under the illusion of self-sufficiency. We think "I've got this. I

don't need help. I certainly don't need God. I know what's best for me."

Good actors value good direction. Good disciples depend on divine direction. When we try to control people and circumstances around us, we are playing God. We are trying to be the director of God's creation and Kingdom. And the truth is...we're not good at being God. In fact, we are cataclysmic failures at it. We depend on God's guidance. We let go of control and allow God to direct us. Only when we relinquish control to God's direction can we spiritually thrive in this life.

And remember, God delights in every detail of our life. God is our director; we are but actors playing out God's will on earth. Though we may stumble, we will not fall.

Meals on Wheels (MOW) is our Mission on Weekends (MOW)

It's been a very rewarding and successful year for the Meals on Wheels mission program. We have 3 cooking teams who plan menus, shop for and prepare meals 3 weeks a month (2nd, 3rd and 4th Saturdays.) Other member volunteers show up faithfully every Saturday morning to package the prepared meals and deliver them to our clients.

Lifestream Church is responsible for the 1st Saturday and the Methodist church prepares the meal for the 5th Saturday (in our kitchen) which Peace Lutheran delivers.

In 2022 PCW volunteered over 1000 hours of their time - planning, shopping, prepping, packaging and delivering over 2800 meals.

We were fortunate enough last year to have had substantial grant funding for this mission but we won't have as much funding available in 2023 so we are having to make adjustments. Beginning in March we will be providing one meal per client each weekend instead of 2 and instead of buying desserts we would like to provide homemade desserts whenever possible.

Donations from Panera Bread will provide some of these baked items, but we would like to develop "Cookie Teams." The ingredients will be supplied, but we are hoping people will help with the preparation, baking and/or packaging. Any desserts have to be prepared in our commercial kitchen since we are serving the public so we can't accept items made at home.

This would not be an extensive time commitment. We typically serve 35-40 people a week so 6 dozen cookies would cover one week. We have a new chest freezer in the kitchen so you or your team can bake when you want and freeze for future use. Children are invited to join teams....you can make it a family affair. Our cooks will assist as much as possi-

ble. If you only want to come in and bake and package the cookies, a cook can have the dough ready for you.

We plan to shop for meat and chicken when it's on sale and in order to keep it fresh we will use a vacuum sealer. If you'd like to help with that part of this mission we can arrange a time for a vacuum sealing party. This event wouldn't take place very often and would require no cooking skills and little clean-up!

We are establishing a rotating schedule for our entrees to simplify shopping and inventory maintenance. As needed in the future we will provide a list of needed recipe ingredients. If you are able to provide any of the items we request, please know that every extra pound of pasta, can of soup, jar of spaghetti sauce, etc. that is donated will be a tremendous help!

We welcome anyone interested in supporting this mission. If you prefer washing dishes to cooking...we have a place for you. If you want to be a cook's assistant and chop vegetables instead of plan menus...we have a place for you. If you want to deliver meals but don't want to go alone we can pair you up with someone.

If you want to help pack the lunches into bags for delivery ...we have a place for you. If you just want to sit and visit while others cook... that's ok too.

Supporting this mission doesn't commit you to a specific number of hours or monthly time commitment. We need people as back up if someone can't fill their assigned spot. Being part of this mission is such a delicious opportunity for fellowship and it is so rewarding to know you are helping those less fortunate.

Remember as Jesus said "for I was hungry and you gave me food...". Matthew 25:35




