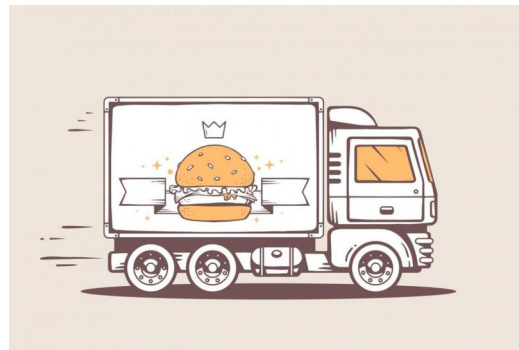

Maundy Thursday Soup Recipes

CHEESEBURGER SOUP

1/2 lb. ground beef
3/4 cup chopped onion
3/4 cup shredded carrot
3/4 cup diced celery
1 tsp. dried basil
1 tsp. dried parsley flakes
4 Tbsp. butter divided
1 Tbsp. olive oil
3 cups chicken broth
4 cups diced potatoes (approximately 1 3/4 lbs.) 1/4 cup flour
1/2 lb. shredded cheese (cheddar or Monty jack) 1 1/2 cups milk
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
1/4 cup sour cream (optional)
Garlic and herb salt free seasoning



In a 3 quart sauce pan season ground beef with herb seasoning and brown. Drain beef and set aside. In the same pan sauté vegetables, parsley and basil in 1 Tbsp. butter and olive oil until vegetables are tender about 10 minutes.

Add broth, potatoes and cooked beef. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 10-12 minutes until potatoes are tender.

Meanwhile in a small skillet, melt remaining butter. Add flour; cook and stir 3-5 minutes or until bubbly. Add to soup and bring to a boil. Cook and stir for 2 minutes. Reduce heat to low. Add cheese, milk, salt and pepper. Cook and stir until cheese melts. Remove from heat; blend in sour cream if desired.

Yield: 8 servings (2 1/4 quarts)

CHICKEN RICE VEGETABLE SOUP

2 boxes chicken broth
1 boneless chicken breast cut into cubes 3 carrots chopped
1 onion chopped
3 stalks celery chopped
1 cup cooked rice
Salt free Garlic and Herb seasoning blend Chicken soup base
Parsley
Butter and olive oil for sautéing

Sauté the chicken in butter and olive oil until cooked.

Sauté vegetables until tender crisp in olive oil and butter and season with a spoonful of soup base. Combine broth, chicken and vegetables. Season with herb mix and parsley. Cook rice. Add to soup and simmer until flavors have blended.

Yield: 4 servings

Note: The stated portions are estimates. Depending on your taste preferences you may choose to use a different amount of broth, chicken or vegetables. Adding the rice after it was cooked gave the soup a thicker consistency.
