A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

October is one of my favorite months of the year. I love the crisp fall weather, the changing leaves, warm apple cider, football games and getting ready for Halloween! I loved Halloween as a kid. I remember running down the street in my Casper the Friendly Ghost costume shouting "Halloween is my favorite day ever!" as my parents and sister tried to keep up.

My only Halloween night tradition that I try to keep now that I am older is to turn out all the lights and watch a horror movie after the trickor-treaters have gone and everyone in the house has gone to bed (Karen and Alex aren't big fans of the horror genre). I love the thrill of being scared by a good horror story, be it a film or book.

I don't however, the love the reality of being scared. I don't like being afraid of things that could actually cause me or my loved ones harm. Who does? But, unfortunately, we have all dealt with fears in our lives. Some of us have experienced health related fears. Some live in the daily state of economic fear. Fears of being alone, of failing, of being vulnerable or of conflict can keep us emotionally paralyzed.

Fear can be fun when it's associated with Halloween. Fear can be crippling in our day-to-day lives. But, there is Good News for those who have so many fears.

The Psalmist of Psalm 34 experienced deliverance from all fears when he sought the Lord. This deliverance is available to us as well. But, it is up to us to seek God and wait for God's answer. For some of us, this might happen rather instantaneously. We experience fear, we say a prayer, God removes the fear from within us. BOOM! Notice that God doesn't often take away the object of our fear. Instead, God removes our negative reaction to that object and frees us up to deal with person, situation, event, etc. in a healthy, calm and productive manner.

For most of us though, that deliverance from fear takes some time and more effort. We experience fear, we say a prayer...and we wait. Some of us experience impatience in this waiting and assume that God doesn't hear us or doesn't care. But, "seeking God" is not a one time event. It is a discipline and a process. We keep seeking, we keep asking, we keep praying. And, as we keep seeking, we grow in our capacity to handle our fears.

So, when you feel afraid, seek God, go to God in prayer. Pray for deliverance from your fear. That means praying for courage, confidence, insight, comfort, strength, guidance, etc. You may be blessed enough to feel a change immediately. But, more likely, if you keep praying, keep working and keep seeking God, you will gradually feel a change happening within you. Fear will fade. And, confidence in the Lord will grow in its place.

Wayne's father passed away when he was a boy, leaving Wayne to be the "man of the house" at seven years of age. Wayne was driving the tractor at eight and focused on helping his Mother run the farm. Wayne used to laugh and say he learned his worth when his mother and step father purchased a cow milking machine when he went off to college! Wayne, at the urging of his mother, attended Southwest Baptist teachers' college in Bolivar Mo, and returned home to teach a couple years in his hometown.

Wayne later attended the University of Missouri, Columbia earning a degree in agriculture. He met and later married his wife of almost 68 years, Marie, who was also a student at University of MO. Wayne enlisted in the Air Force and served 20 years, one of those years in the Korean war. He trained in the Air Force to be a meteorologist and later attended Officer Candidate training and was commissioned as an officer. Wayne provided weather predictions for several classified military operations. Some of his stories were about standing up to Generals who wanted to commence a mission when weather conditions might compromise the missions. Wayne completed his degree in Meteorology while serving on active duty, attending Penn Sate and Texas A&M. Wayne went on to work for the meteorological library at Scott Air Base. After retiring from civil service he volunteered as the head of the Retiree Support Center at Scott Air Base.


