To facilitate that learning, and to make it more intimate, flexible and appealing, we are hoping to put together 4-5 small groups that meet weekly at various times of the week. These groups will meet at different locations and will focus on different topics. These small groups will help build more intimate relationships within the church and also provide what is sometimes called "back doors" to the church. That means small groups are alternative introductions to the life of PCW. Someone may be



apprehensive to visit a worship service, but they may be more likely to visit a small gathering in someone's home!

In order to make this vision a reality, we need 4 or 5 small group leaders. Curriculum and guidance will be provided to all volunteer leaders. We also could use 4-5 "hosts" who would open up their home to one of these groups. There will also be a survey for anyone interested in participating or learning more about this ministry.
