Dear Friends,

PCW CONNECT

Many people have asked me the following question: "What's next?"

During Lent, over 30 friends and members participated in discussion groups as part of our "Growing Young" initiative. Many others who couldn't participate in the live discussion groups read the book "Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church." Ideas were shared and concerns were voiced. And, whether you read the book and participated in discussion groups, or just

read the book, or only prayed for God's discernment, you probably have the same question: "What's next?"

Before I answer that question, let me get everyone up to speed on the results of the discussion groups. Many ideas were expressed during our discussion groups on how we might be

able to attract more young families and young adults to our congregation. On the last discussion meeting, the groups whittled that list down to 16 "priorities" that we all felt were the best ideas that fell in line with the suggestions from the book. 12 of those priorities are "short term goals" or things that we can change or adapt relatively quickly. 4 of those priorities are "long term goals," or goals that will take more effort and resources. These are the BIG ideas so to speak.

But, before we rush to change anything, the book recommends taking a very important next step: LISTEN-ING. Considering that step, we have put together a small Listening Team made up of David Brunworth, Mauri Truesdell, Gerry Urban and me. Everyone on this team has read the book and participated in the discussion group. The Listening Team's goal is to not only gather information from our younger people on what they see as strengths and challenges with PCW, but to also spend time listening to their stories and getting to know them all better.

This team will be tasked with actively listening to the following:

- 1. God's direction through prayer and meditation. See scripture passage above Matthew 7:4.
- 2. Younger people from our membership, friends and families. The Listening Team elected to define "Younger" in our context as under 49.
- 3. Parents, Sunday school teachers and youth ministry volunteers.

So, here's "What's Next?"

- 1. The Listening Team will be mailing letters to all of the younger people giving them a "heads up" that someone from the team will be calling them soon.
- 2. The Listening Team will make phone calls to all younger people to explain our goal and the Growing Young Initiative. We will then ask them if they would be willing to speak with two members of the Listening Team.
- 3. All those willing to speak in person with the Listening Team will schedule appointments (in person, by Zoom, etc).
- 4. All those who were not able to meet with the Listening Team will be sent an online survey.
- 5. The Listening Team will then gather to process all the data and communicate their findings with the Session first and then the rest of the congregation.

Once all of this is done (prayerfully before the summer is over), the Session will elect a Growing Young Team to process the book, the priority list and the Listening Team report and begin implementing any changes.

So, that's "What's Next?" for now. Please be in prayer for the Listening Team as they engage God's will in their call.




