PASTOR'S PEN

The future can be a scary, intimidating thing. We are always afraid of the unknown and we don't know what the future holds for us. Yet, at the same time, it's hard not to get filled with hope and possibilities. At the beginning of a new year, it's hard not to look forward and dream big. THIS year will be different! THIS year things will finally change.

New Year's Day is a chance to look forward AND look back. We look back at 2022 with either fondness or frustration, depending on our experiences. We either want things to stay the same in 2023 or we NEED them to change. But, change itself can be a scary thing. Are we willing to change our behaviors and attitudes in order to help God bring about those changes? Or will fear of change and the unknown prevent us from growing as individuals and as a church.

The words from God to Joshua and the people of Israel quoted above have helped me overcome those times when I become afraid to make a change in my life. God is with me. God will be with me wherever I go. There is no reason for me to be afraid or dismayed. And with that knowledge, I can be strong and courageous. I hope you can apply these words to your own life and situation. And, I hope we can apply this to our congregational life as well.

For nearly ten years, I have heard the same refrain: "We need more young families. We need more young families. We need more young families." I wish I had a blueprint for how to attract young families to church, because if I did, I would write a book that every church could put in their library. I have read many books with different theories and theologies on how to attract young families to engage with the church.

One theme I read again and again is that churches that want to get younger need to ask themselves this question: "Do we REALLY want to get younger?"

Because, the churches that have been successful at reaching young families have two things in common. One, they were strong and courageous enough to make significant changes in how they worshipped, educated, fellowshipped and served. And two, they dedicated considerable resources into those changes.

Those are scary steps to take: change and investment. Will the changes and investments net the results we pray for? Maybe...
Maybe not. I have been praying about some possible ideas that could work. But, vision doesn't always come with guarantees. I'll share those ideas at a different time. But, before I spring these

ideas on the congregation, we have to take a look at ourselves.

So, as we stand at the brink of 2023, I have these questions to post to the congregation. Does the Presbyterian Church of Washington REALLY want to attract young families? Are we ready to stop lamenting our age or are we ready to take actions that will require risk? Can we find strength and courage in our faith that God will be with us wherever we go?

In 2023, let's answer these questions together and dare to dream of significant change.

SCRIP GIFT CARD PUR-CHASES are EASY fundraising that helps our church immensely and immediately!

The Presby Scrip Program sells gift cards to you, and OUR church gets an immediate cash percentage just for selling those cards to you!

- 1. You purchase a gift card through the Scrip Program. (You buy a \$25 gift card and you GET
 - a \$25 gift card.)
- 2. All the merchants pay the National Scrip Program an incentive for each gift card purchased.
- 3. The National Scrip Program passes that incentive to our Church's Scrip Program.
- 4. YOU get a church contribution credit for the funds that your card purchase gives to OUR church as a rebate percent! (One \$25 card may have a 10% rebate, so that adds \$2.50 for that one gift card purchase to your church contribution statement. Does any other store purchase do THAT?!)
- 5. At the end of the year our Scrip Program donates this money to our Church Fundraiser Account.
- 6. Our Presby Scrip Program donates on average \$2000 each year!
