A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends.

The view out of my window is changing! As I write out my monthly letter to all of you, I can look out my office window and see yellow daffodils blooming, the grass is getting greener, the magnolia trees are blossoming and little red buds are surfacing on numerous trees around our beautiful patio area. All this amazing color is returning Many of us are yearning, anticipating, and even at to the world!

I hear birds chirping (I haven't caught a glimpse of a blue bird, yet. But I'm watching for them!), gentle wind blowing through my open window and all of the familiar neighborhood sounds coming to life again.

And visitors are scrambling past my window. I have yet to see a lizard scurrying over the patio, but I'm sure I will soon. Squirrels have been chasing each other playfully. Neighborhood dogs have been sniffing the trails of other animals. And, a number of humans have begun their work at readying our mission garden for the spring!

What life! Six weeks ago, my view was stark, monochrome, and still. Now, everything is coming back to life all through my view. How can I look at this scene and not be filled with gratitude? Spring is here, winter (at least the worst of it!) is over. Life is happening outside our windows again.

The bleakness of Lent is nearly over. The joy of resurrection morning is almost upon us. Many of us have been participating in daily devotions: Examining ourselves and trying to find God all around us. We have been yearning, anticipating, and even at times aching for Easter morning.




