### PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

Every Easter morning, we sneak those words into our liturgy. And typically, when I either say "He is risen!" or when everyone responds with "He is Risen Indeed!" we overlook those exclamation points. And instead, we sound about as excited about Easter morning as we are a trip to the dentist.

Easter is a big deal! I know we've celebrated many Easters in our lifetime, but Jesus rising from the dead is about as big a deal as deal can get! Perhaps, that's part of our problem. I've seen 51 Easters now (soon to be 52). I don't remember all of them or even half of them. I can probably only recall with distinction and clarity about a dozen Easters. We've been there and we've done that. Many of us know the resurrection story so well, it has lost any element of novelty. "Can we move on to Holy Humor Sunday, already?"

Even the possibility of life after death loses its luster for us. Death seems far away in the unknown future (or at least it does for many of us). Eternal life seems like an eternity away. "Why should I be so focused on eternal life when I have so many concerns in this one?" We behave and think as if Christ's resurrection bears little meaning on how we live in the here and now.

I'd like you to note a detail in the quote of John 20:1. Mary came to the tomb "while it was still dark." Now, that may seem like a fairly insignificant detail. It was early on that Sunday morning, so what? John could have just written "early on the first day" or "very early on the first day." But, each of the four Gospel writers record that the women came to the tomb in the dark. Mark and John both say, "while it was still dark." Matthew and Luke note they came "as it was dawning." As the knowledge of Christ's resurrection dawned on Mary, so too did the dawn pierce the darkness.

Don't forget those exclamation points on Easter Sunday this year!

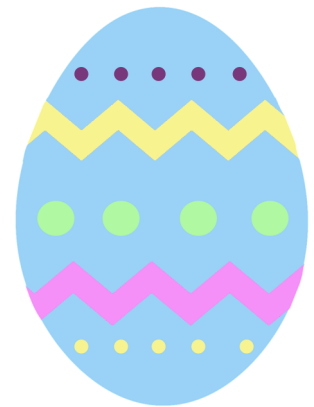
**Easter Egg Hunt – April 8<sup>th</sup>**

## Inter-Generational Mission Trip

They are developing Phase 1 of 3 phases that will eventually house 70-80 residents. Currently they house approximately 15 residents and staff. Bethel Hills is located at 10450 Voelkerding Rd, Dutzow, MO.



We will be working on housing, gardening, and facility projects on their 127 acres of beautiful land. There is a job for everyone regardless of your physical ability or skill level. On Friday, June 2nd we will be arriving at 12:30 pm and doing service projects from 1-4:00 pm. Participants will then be joined by the staff and residents of Bethel Hills for dinner. You will get to meet some of the residents that we are working for and hear the faith journey that has created Bethel Hills.

After dinner, we will have a campfire worship service complete with guitars and singing that everyone will enjoy. If you need a comfortable lawn chair – you can bring one!

Youth and vetted chaperons can spend the night, which will include an evening of energetic activities and games in the gymnasium. Girls will be staying in the hostel section of the event center and the boys will be staying in the locker room section of the gymnasium. Sleeping bags will be required for everyone.

Saturday morning will start off with a hearty breakfast for those spending the night. Anyone joining us on Saturday will arrive at 9:00 am. Service projects will be from 9:30-11:30 am. Luncheon and worship service will be provided at noon. Afternoon service projects will be from 1-4:00 pm. With goodbyes and departure by 5:00 pm.

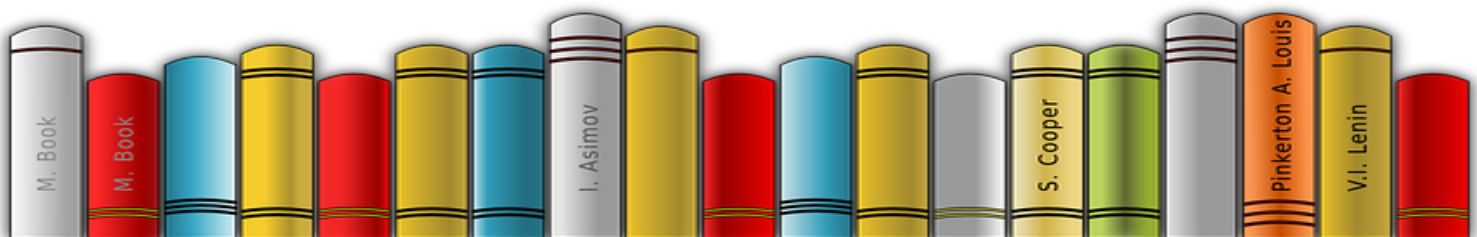

Please feel free and I encourage anyone to sign up and volunteer to organize books into their categories for any set-up days and, the fun part!, for our two day Book Sale. No heavy lifting required at any point during set-up and the Book Sale, unless you are very able to! We can use all the help possible as it will get busy!! At the Sale, we need people to direct customers to certain areas (we have maps!), people to help check-out (very easy!), people to help bag books (super easy!), and, in general, people to help answer questions (generally easy, but Gretchen and Kathy are here for the tough questions!).

Did you know that we have several different types of missions that we do at our Book Sale?
