PCW CONNECT

In the next few weeks, we will all have an opportunity to celebrate Pastor Pat and the many accomplishments he has shared with our church family at the Presbyterian Church of Washington. We have many wonderful memories and Pastor Pat's contributions will not be forgotten. We wish the best to Pastor Pat, Karen, and Alex in their new church home.

As we look to the future, hopefully, this letter will help with clarification of the process moving forward. All pastoral relationships that might be es-

tablished, changed, or dissolved are only done with the approval of the Presbytery as stated in the Book of Order. The official form "Dissolution of Pastoral Call Voluntary Resignation" has been signed by Pastor Pat and myself and presented to the Presbytery. This document goes to the Commission on Ministry for approval.

The Presbytery is our companion during this transitional period and will be in constant contact with us. This process has been totally redesigned and aligned to provide support to churches. A Presbytery liaison will provide resources, guidance and other services needed as we go through the pastoral search process.

The process of securing an Interim/ Transitional Pastor will start as soon as possible. Our Session will lay out the basics as well as hopes and dreams. The Presbytery may have recommendations for an Interim Pastor, but our Session will make the decision. Once an Interim is in place, the process of securing our new pastor could take some time. The Interim Pastor will have a one-year agreement which can be extended if needed. The Interim Pastor will handle all duties within the church including management of staff, overseeing the building, working with committees and other duties.

It appears a great deal of patience will be needed as this process can be lengthy, which is frustrating to all of us. Rev. Joy Myers, Stated Clerk, shared some additional details. The Commission on Ministry (COM) will assign a partner from the Presbytery who will guide us in this process. We must complete a Mission Study which needs to be approved by our Session, our congregation and the Commission On Ministry. After this is done, we can request permission to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Our partner from the Commission On Ministry will help guide us through the process. There is a new form from the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) that is called a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) which will be completed by the Pastor Nominating Committee, approved by the Commission On Ministry as well as Session. Once this is approved it will be uploaded to the Church Leadership Connection and we will be able to receive applications from pastors. Our church family is strong; we will persevere.

Rev. Ellen Gurnon, Pastor of First Presbyterian Church and Westminster Presbyterian Church in Cape Girardeau, as well as the Moderator of the Commission On Ministry, has shared Stephanie Knopf will serve as Moderator of our Session until a transitional pastor has been hired. Our Session has already met Stephanie as she was a guest when Pastor Pat announced his resignation.

The responsibility of the congregation during this time is very important in the pastoral call process. We must all continue to support the ministry of the church through prayers, participation, and financial support during this time of pastoral transition. We must put careful thought into electing the Pastoral Nominating Committee, which will happen down the road, as well as praying for this committee regularly. Ultimately the congregation will elect the new pastor, approve the terms of call and be welcoming.

The Presbytery will also have a role in background checks for finalists being considered. The Presbytery must examine the Pastoral Nominating Committee's finalist for Presbytery membership and agree with the final decision before a call can be issued.

The Presbytery is quite fond of acronyms, some of which might be new to us. They are included in this letter should you read additional information in the future and need to know. Also, here is a link to a resource which has additional information. This document was written in 2015 so a few things may have been updated but it contains great information.


All Saint's Sunday



Laura Gentry Fenner September 6, 1960 – September 23, 2023 63 years, two weeks and three days.

Laura was born in Santa Monica, CA to Tom & Sharon Fenner. Because Laura entered school before the Education for All Handicapped Children Act (1975) & the Americans With Disabilities Act (1990), her early education was quite piecemeal. She attended the Cerebral Palsy School, the Pacific Palisades Presbyterian Church's class for Exceptional Children, the John F. Kennedy Special School, & Santa Paula, CA public schools.

The Fenners moved to Washington in 1970, at which time Laura began St. Mary's School for Exceptional Children in St. Louis. The Fenners are indebted to the Archdiocese of St. Louis for meeting Laura's educational needs at that time. Laura attended St. Mary's School & St. Joseph's Vocational Center from the ages 10-21 years old.

Laura began her working life at The Sheltered Workshop of Washington in 1982, where she primarily worked on corn cob pipe cards & "nuts & bolts" for the next 15 years. In 1997, Laura moved away from home to the Emmaus Marthasville campus & lived there until 2017. While in Marthasville, she worked at the Temco Sheltered Workshop until her retirement. She also participated in the Exceptional Equestrians program for many years.

Most recently, Laura was living in independent supported living, "the Kuenzel House," in Washington, operated by Emmaus. Her housemates were Debbie & Margie & she had many beloved caregivers there. A large portion of Laura's heart was reserved for Shari Voepel. The Fenners are indebted to the United Church of Christ for establishing The Emmaus Homes & supporting it for 130 years. Also, thank you to everyone in Franklin County who voted for disability resources under SB40 in 1986. Your votes made such a difference.
