Now, I should say one last word about our relationship going forward. Texts and emails to me are still okay. But, I must be careful in how, or if, I respond. As you are letting me go, I must also let you go as well.

In any church, there are always those members who have special bonds with the pastor, sometimes through friendship, sometimes because the pastor was there when a loved one died, or any number of reasons. One temptation churches have when a pastor leaves is to ask that pastor to come back for significant events — weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc. Our denomination has a very clear ethics policy by which everyone serving a church is expected to abide. Included in this is the understanding that I will not be coming back to perform weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc. If there are extenuating cir-

cumstances, an exception may be made, but even then, I would have to be expressly invited by the pastor or moderator of session.

We have this policy because when former pastors return for these significant events, they hinder the ability of the current pastor to effectively be the pastor of the congregation. All of which means, if you ask and I say no, don't take it personally. I still love you! I just can't marry you.

I will continue to pray for this congregation for a bright and fruitful future! May God go with you all!


#### Pledge Sunday - 11/12
