<u>A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR</u>

Dear Friends,

Growing up Lutheran in Minnesota, giving something up for Lent was a big deal. I imagine that many of our Catholic neighbors here in Washington give things up for Lent as well. When I was a kid, I gave up sweets once, chocolate another time, and I'm sure I did other things as well. I also remember never making it all the way to Easter as I fasted from something. I always caved. Sometimes early, sometimes later. But, I always gave in to temptation.

Giving things up for Lent is not a big practice in Presbyterian circles. We don't promote the practice often, but it is not because we don't believe fasting from something is a good idea. I have been asked many times, "Why do we have to give up something for Lent?" I usually answer, "You don't HAVE to give up anything."

The practice of fasting during Lent comes from the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert for 40 days and 40 nights. During that time, he fasted. The season of Lent is a season of preparation and self-examination as we approach the joy of Easter morning. Lent technically lasts 46 days, but the six Sundays from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday are considered "Feast" days, so people who fast are allowed to break their fast on Sundays.

After a lot of thought I have decided what I am going to fast from this year. Sure, I could give up fast food, candy, etc. And, it would probably be really good for me. But, I really want to give up something this year for Lent that has plagued me most of my life: Worry. And, I'm going to try not to take Sundays as "Feast" days and pig out on worrying.

I know that I am highly unlikely to make it through to Pastor Pat Easter from Ash Wednesday without worrying. But,

I have decided that each time I catch myself excessively worrying during Lent, I will do my best to stop, whether that's taking a walk, breathing exercises, reaching out to someone, prayer, etc. And, after I stop worrying, I will keep fasting from worry until Easter (or, hopefully beyond). When I was younger and would give in to temptation and have a Reece's Peanut Butter Cup when I was supposed to be fasting from chocolate, I would shrug my shoulders and say to myself, "Well, I guess my fast is over," and then eat chocolate like normal.

But, I want this Lent to be different. And, I hope you do as well. The slow roll out of vaccines, post-election drama, Coronavirus concerns, and other concerns are heightening my worry, and I imagine you may feel the same. But, I want this Lent to be different, since this year is different in so many ways. I want to feel less anxiety. And, I believe, with God's strength and grace, I can at the very least give up excessive worry and anxiety. I may not be completely FREE of anxiety, but I can at least develop the healthy spiritual habit of turning to God for strength and allowing God, who is in control and I am not, to worry about the situation on my behalf.

So, if you feel yourself being consumed by some negative emotion or feeling this Lent, consider giving it up. And, have the realistic expectation that you will likely fail from time to time before Easter comes. But, give yourself grace like God gives you grace. Pick yourself up, dust yourself off, and start your fast again.

You may feel that you can't do it. But, with God, you CAN.

May you all have a blessed Lenten season. Pastor Pat

Harvest Table 2021 dates

We are continuing our wonderful tradition of participating in the Harvest Table community meals this year, although they may look a bit different until we get through this global pandemic. Currently, we are just providing the desserts and nothing else, not even volunteers, as there are a limited amount of people allowed in the kitchen during meal prep and all the meals are handed out during a drive through/hand out process every Saturday evening at St. Peter's UCC. Our 2021 dates are set for: January 30, May 22, August 28 and November 20. We are completely set with desserts for January 30 due to some volunteers in our church making and freezing 300 cookies and our May 22 date will have the desserts done by our own Youth Group kids! The need for Covid 19 Guidelines were discussed for serving families desiring food following a service in the death of a loved one. A subcommittee consisting of Beth Bonney and Sarah Spear explored safe guidelines and practices for food service during the pandemic. Tom and Gretchen Farrell were a tremendous help in reviewing the guidelines and offering suggestions. The PCW Church Life Guidelines were developed and adopted by the committee. The main points are:

Limiting guests to 25 clustered in "family pods"

Guests remain seated with table pitchers of water and lemonade.

Disposable flatware (wrapped with a napkin) and plates placed on the table in advance.

Meals served family style or simple buffet.

Plexiglass on kitchen window or an extra row of tables placed in front of the window to protect the family and workers.

Family chooses the meat dish which will be purchased from a caterer (Droege's, Aldo's or Williams Brothers).

Family chooses two sides from a committee list which will be prepared by 1-2 committee members in our kitchen.

Committee will ask for donations from church members for ingredients (ex. Frozen Hash Brown Potatoes, large 101 ounce cans of green beans, cheese, sour cream etc.).

These guidelines were followed as our Church Life Committee provided a luncheon for the family of Mary Washabaugh Thursday, January 7, 2021. Beth Bonney prepared mashed potatoes and green beans on Wednesday. The main dish was chicken delivered by Droege's and it worked like a charm. The family was extremely complimentary regarding Pastor Pat as they loved his message and manner.

We are delighted to have Jane Bugele join the Church Life Committee. We look forward to planning some great activities in 2021 for our Church Family.






