### Dear Friends,

Back in January of this year, the Session approved a new church logo designed by Digital Congregations through our Outreach Committee. There have been some concerns brought forward about the new logo (what does this mean for our "old" logo?) since it was approved. I apologize that this letter wasn't written earlier, but I do want to address some concerns and give a little history into the process that brought us to our

new logo.

First, I would like to address the concern I have heard the most. What happens to our old logo? I want to assure you all that we are

still very much a denomination of the PC(USA). We are not planning on leaving the denominational logo behind. It will remain on our carpet and on our signage and many other places we have grown accustomed to seeing it.

Second, let me explain the history behind the logo. Last year, Session formed an Online Outreach Task Force to formulate a strategy that would enhance our online presence and promote our congregation to the community through the digital world. We no longer wanted to be "Washington's best kept secret." One of the first things the task force realized was the need for our own congregation-specific logo. This would set us apart from the countless other PC(USA) congregations and make our "brand" more readily identifiable online.

Once the Outreach Committee was officially formed, one of our top priorities was to design a new logo. We voted to contract with Digital Congregations, an organization that I had/have been taking courses through for my continuing education, to send us some mock-ups. This endeavor was funded through the generosity of a member family.

Digital Congregations interviewed a handful of us Pastor Pat

extensively to get a feel for PCW. What sets us apart, what is our passion, what do want the community to know about us? We all agreed that our logo should say something about who we are, not just what denomination to which we belong. After looking at various options, choosing fonts and colors, the Outreach Committee agreed that a heart shaped logo represented the love, warmth and hospitality that sets PCW apart from other congregations. The cross in the middle represents

What's with the New Logo? The cross in the middle represents our Christ-Focused mission while the heart "embraces" that mission. Love and Mission. Two strong words that accurately describe PCW.

The Outreach Committee presented the new logo to the Session. There was much discussion on color schemes, but we are free to "play around" with the color as each project warrants. The Session eventually approved the Maroon and Gold "Heart of Christ" logo.

The Session's and Outreach Committee's goal is that the community (physical and online) comes to recognize and associate our logo with our congregation. This will take some time. Establishing a consistent "brand" always does. If they see our new logo on our sign, and then see it online, we pray that the new logo "rings bells" with potential visitors and supporters and encourages them to look into us by visiting our social media pages and our website.

I do acknowledge that the logo may not be "your cup of tea." It may look too informal for you or remind you of an existing logo for another organization. But, please give it time. Change is always a little uncomfortable. The PC(USA) logo took a number of years back in the 80s to be readily accepted. In time, prayerfully, our "Heart of Christ" logo will feel comfortable and identifiable to all.


