Year in Review

Lindy Harrell Initiatives

All five initiatives to help empower our CASAs were implemented. These initiatives were agreed upon in the previous fiscal year and consist of: counseling support, trauma training, a children's fund, mileage support and peer to peer gatherings. The initiatives were initially made possible and named after the generous legacy gift we received from former CASA Lindy Harrell. Midway through the year we were fortunate to be awarded a significant gift from the Episcopal Community Foundation to help us kickstart the implementation of all five initiatives.

Assessments

Our program spent a great deal of time strategically analyzing our service and what might enable us to close the gap between the number of children we serve and the number of children in our area in need of CASA volunteers. Part of this analysis was researching how best to recruit and retain our CASAs, as well as how to further create a Board culture of engagement and accountability. A recurring theme was that our large geographic footprint causes real challenges for PR, volunteer recruitment/training and fundraising.

Looking Forward-2025


On September 5th our Board of Directors voted unanimously to change our program's service area from the Northern and Mountain Judicial Circuits to the Mountain Judicial Circuit. This decision opened the door for the Northern Circuit to establish its own CASA program.

Throughout the year we will continue to assess the impact of the Lindy Harrell initiatives and how we can best support and empower our CASA volunteers.

With federal grant funding cuts and the provision of a portion of our agency resources to ensure firm establishment of a sustainable CASA program in the Northern Circuit, we will be focused on growing individual gifts and fundraising event revenues.






Doug and Karen Conkle 2024 Volunteer of the Year

Board Member Leadership Award Nominee

Sam Johnson is currently in his 6th year of service on the Board. Immediately upon his becoming a director, he assumed leadership roles. He served as Board Treasurer for nearly 3 years. In 2022, he led a taskforce which explored options for utilizing a significant legacy gift Northeast Georgia CASA received. After serving as treasurer, he became Board Vice Chair. He was the golf tournament committee chair for two years, and this fiscal year he served as Board Chair until mid-May.

Through all his roles, it is his leadership, his grasp of the CASA mission, and his focus on delegation that has led him to excel and obtain results. As Chair, Sam went well above and beyond what is required of any Board member. Northeast Georgia CASA has never had a board member who has dedicated as much time and energy in a six-month period as Sam. One of our judges recently mentioned that they have never seen a board so engaged, and this is a direct result of Sam's leadership.




