Eligibility:

- For all relative programs, the relative must be related to the child by blood, marriage or adoption.

 To be eligible for subsidies, children must be in DFCS custody or have exited DFCS custody with the subsidy authorized. A subsidy cannot be granted post permanency. Children in a safety resource or who exit a safety resource via transfer of custody to a caregiver are **NOT** eligible for subsidy.
