### A Message from Deacon Gary Harmeyer

Dear Holy Apostles' Friends,

I'm sure you will all agree it was good news to hear that Father Mario plans to return from his short-term disability on Tuesday, May 4th. One member put it bluntly when she said that May was Mental Health Awareness month and Father Mario's openness with his struggle with depression was courageous when many people would be inclined to hide their diagnosis. His openness will help others face similar challenges without the shame that some associate with any mental health issue.

At services on both Sunday, April 18th and Sunday, April 25th, Father Mario's letter to Holy Apostles was read. It states:

April 15, 2021

Greetings in the name of the risen Christ!

First, I want to thank each of you for your support, prayers, cards, and so many other signs of love that you have given to my beloved Catherine and yours truly during my short-term disability. I cannot tell you how affirming it feels to those of us with mental health issues to be embraced in this matter.

I write to share the good news that my therapy team believes that I am ready to once again be with you and return to ministry. If it is our Heavenly Father's will, I will be back on Tuesday, May 4th, 2021. I am very excited about restarting our journey together in discerning the will of God for us, and preaching with our words and actions the gospel of Jesus Christ. I look forward to once again to holding up the blessed sacrament at the altar and sharing with you the gifts of God for the people of God.

In the meantime, please continue to keep us in your prayers. I also have a request: this evening say a short prayer for anyone struggling with mental health issues. Once again muchas gracias, thank you, and may the blessing of the holy and undivided Trinity be with you all.

### Highlights from Vestry Council April 20th

Financial Update: March 2021

YTD Income: \$ 79,661.36 YTD Expense: \$ 57,529.31 YTD Excess: \$22,132.05

March Income: \$50,566.68 March Expenses: \$22,364.96 Net Income: \$28,201.72

- March's Income is skewed because of a \$25,000 legacy gift from Anita Watson's estate. Also, expenses were higher because of the purchase of the new lawn mower.
- ◆ The re-gathering for in-person liturgies is going well, and the Fellowship Hall overflow has been mainly used for those arriving after the liturgy begins. Because the number of attendees in the Fellowship Hall is small, they have been directed to receive Communion in the sanctuary.
- Slips of paper which states "this seat is occupied" are given to in-person attendees as they enter the sanctuary. This will ensure if the person leaves their seat before the service begins to talk to someone, their seat will not be given away to someone else and the slips of paper marks which seats need to be disinfected following the service. Reserved seating can be arranged for those needing special accommodations.
- Fr. Mario plans to return on Tuesday, May 4th with his first service on Sunday, May 9th.
- VIRTUS and Safe Church training are both given virtually. Vestry Council members are required to have this training. Please contact Dianne if you need assistance signing up.
- ♦ The office's heat pump (installed in 1997) needs to be replaced before summer. Bids for its replacement are now being requested.
- Community Building is a project by the VB School System to provide free meals to needy school age children who are currently attending school virtually at home. There are a number of these children at the Twin Canal's housing. Holy Apostles has been asked if they could assist with the distribution of meals to the Twin Canal housing once a week. Holy Apostles has accepted this invitation and will begin distributing meals on Tuesdays, noon to 1 pm, beginning May 4th (the program concludes at the end of the school year in mid-June). If you would like to volunteer, contact Whitney McDaniel.
- The Girl Scouts will begin to work on their outside garden.
- Holy Apostles will submit a grant request to the Richmond Diocese for assistance in funding the installation of handicap accessible front doors.
- ♦ The Administration Committee is looking to enhance the wall behind the altar/ambo area. This was looked at several years ago. With live streaming of services, members believe something more aesthetically pleasing than a cinderblock wall would improve the impression viewers see of our church. Additional information will be forth-coming.
- ◆ The Administration Committee is also investigating power washing the outside walls of the church and some limited repairs to the parking lot. It is anticipated a major capital improvement outlay will need to be made in the next couple of years to resurface the entire parking lot.
- The Saturday morning Men's Group has been disbanded due to lack of interest and participation.

### Your mental health is as important as your physical health!

### May is Mental Health Awareness Month

On May 8<sup>th</sup> we will install a mural and benches in the ViBe's community butterfly garden on Mediterranean Avenue between 18th and 19th streets. This is part of the **Seeds of Hope Mental Health and Wellness Art Project** - a collaboration that includes: The Season for Non-Violence\* Collective; NAMI Coastal Virginia and the ViBe Art District. The members of the collective are focusing on mental health due to the increased stress, anxiety and depression experience by our youth. The students in the collective are attending virtual presentations of NAMI's Ending the Silence and Say It Out Loud as well as using their social media to encourage the friends and class mates to attend.

Each year the collective includes an art project. Artists Amanda and Ericka Hitchcock envisioned a three-dimensional mural that includes containers with seeds available to the public to plant and the following quote by Alfred Lord Tennyson - "If I had a flower for every time I thought of you, I could walk through my garden forever." The mural and benches with planters will be incorporated into the active community butterfly and flower garden on <a href="Mediterranean Avenue between 18th and 19th streets">Mediterranean Avenue between 18th and 19th streets</a>. Kindness stones with mental health and wellness messages will be place in the garden as well as throughout the ViBe district.

Here are a few ways to support Mental Health Awareness Month and this project:

Wear a green ribbon for mental health awareness month. If we are meeting together in May we will distribute them on the first Sunday in May. Change your front porch light to green.

Paint kindness rocks with mental health messages at Zero's at the Oceanfront on 632 Virginia Beach Boulevard and encourage friends and family to do this with you. You can also do it on your own and spread the rocks in your community.

Adopt one of the planters and care for it.

### Ecumenism

### A look at our Ecumenism Goals and how we plan to achieve them:

#### **Ecumenism Goal:**

To educate current and future members of the Church of the Holy Apostles community about ecumenism, to increase understanding of why ecumenism holds special significance for our community; and to become a more visible ecumenical partner in the community.

**Objective 1:** Ensure that each member of the community is provided access to ready, updated resources, when needed and as available, to increase their knowledge and understanding of ecumenism.

**Responsible Party:** Ecumenical small committee and other community members, Christian Formation, Fellowship, Liturgy and clergy

### **Action Items:**

- ♦ Update church library with books (\*organize books according to topics) and other resources related to ecumenism
- Provide monthly news, comments, articles including regular updates from ecumenical officers of both dioceses in the ARChive newsletter devoted exclusively to ecumenism
- ♦ Incorporate ecumenism as an ongoing part of the Christian Formation Program
- Plan ecumenical activities such as luncheons, talks with guest speakers, etc. and invite other churches to participate bi-annually
- Request clergy sermons focus on ecumenism every 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the year

**Objective 2:** Increase visibility of Church of the Holy Apostles as an ecumenical/interfaith community through active representation and participation at ecumenical activities as sponsors/co-sponsors/active participants.

**Responsible Party:** Ecumenical small committee and other community members, Christian Formation, Fellowship, Liturgy, Social Ministry and clergy

### **Action Items:**

- Make known to the congregation when ecumenical activities are occurring and encourage members to attend
- Encourage members to "think outside the box" and to come up with quarterly ecumenical activities
- ♦ Identify and provide presentations on ecumenical activities such as LARCUM, Week of Christian Unity, etc., to increase interest, no less than two weeks prior to the event
- Plan ecumenical activities such as luncheons, talks with guest speakers, etc. and invite other churches to participate bi-annually
- Encourage newer members to become involved through mentorship from members who have participated in these events
- Include publication of events using social media (YouTube, Website, Facebook)
- Support diocesan ecumenical initiatives by sending representatives to be in attendance and to participate, if requested.
