A Message from Deacon Gary

Dear Holy Apostles' friends,

With all the activity in the month of March - two large funerals, Holy Week and the impending departure of Father Mario - our normal Easter letter got lost in the shuffle, so please consider this column to be that letter.

What joy comes as we celebrate our incredible God a God who loves us more than we could ever imagine. And when discussing the miraculous resurrection from the dead, words cannot capture the significant this act leaves us with. There is life after death. Jesus, the Son of God, proved it, he experienced it. What joy and hope we feel as a result.

From the earliest days of Christianity, the resurrection of Jesus was the one, simple, profound experience that served as the totality of the Christian message - it was the Good News! However, the "meaning" of the death and resurrection of Jesus had yet been able to be understood, or to be brought into focus.

Now, after two thousand years, the countless faithful, have been trying to wrap their heads and hearts around this great mystery, in the hopes of trying to understand more clearly what it meant back then and what it means for us today. And so we can say all sorts of things about Easter that would have been impossible for those first believers to say, because we have been contemplating it, wondering about it, praying about it, and puzzling over it, since that first Easter morning.

And so we all can say that today we are "saved" - because we have been rescued from the darkness of sin and darkness. Easter can be seen as our day of redemption - in a way,

- Finance Council Report's Summary: Balance Sheet showed below average income for February, while at the same time expenses were high due to the Communication Project and the purchase of a new refrigerator. Money had been saved up for each of these projects and both had grants to help off-set costs.
- Fr. Mario gave a summary of the February's Annual Diocesan meeting he attended in Williamsburg.
- Deacon Gary continues to visit those parishioners who are homebound and/or in the hospital.
- Spring landscaping includes shrub removal and fire ants treatments.
- Easter is the last Sunday of the month, there will not be a gathering at Manga Qui in March.
- Liturgy committee has Holy Week and Easter liturgies scheduled.
- Christian Formation for adults and children continues. Starting April 1st CHA is offering and hosting a JustFaith Ministry study group.
- Social Ministry continues to distribute money to those in need through the Discretionary Fund.
- Next month Earth Day, Tidewater Sowers of Justice subgroup, Environmental Working Group, plans to celebrate with other churches April 20-21. A display will be set up at Holy Apostles.
- There is a new Discernment Process for finding of a new Episcopal co-pastor. The Senior Warden is assembling committee members. Their job will be to find a replacement for Fr. Mario.
- The Senior Warden is lining up several supply priests for April.



Discernment Committee: Our 2024 Search



We have had many people offer to be on the search committee, so I thought I should give you all an overview of the new option we have opted to follow for the search process. The new Discernment Process differs from our previous processes. 3 people from each denomination will be on the team. The team members are: Bonnie Startt, Steve Stanley, Holly Frey, Barbara Kimpan, Ellen Murphy, and Cliff Hatt.

After Father Mario leaves, on April 1, the Diocese will send us a form to fill out with an overview of Holy Apostles, our needs, and a description of the

position. That must be returned to the Diocese by May 1. Once that has been completed and reviewed, the job description will be posted online. As I am sure you remember, one of the reasons the last search took as long as it did was that we were only considering a male priest. We have decided that this time we will be open to women as well as that greatly increases the pool of candidates, and that should ensure the process does not take as long. Once the process is in place, we are able to hold interviews as soon as we see someone who looks to fit our needs. We do not have to wait and interview all parties at the same time.

The new process came about during the Covid closures and has been very successful for the churches who have opted for this revised process. In that last process we had an Interim priest assigned to us for 30 months. Most of these churches have filled their positions in substantially less time than that 6-12 months. Under the new process, we will fill the position with individual supply priests until such time as we call a Priest in Charge.

The person we call will be named Priest in Charge and will be assigned here

for a 3-year term. During that time, we will look to see how things are working out before offering a permanent position. We may do that as soon as one year. Either party may end the contract during the first year with no reason given.

We are excited to try out this new process and ask you all keep us in your prayers as we begin this new stage in our life here at the Church of the Holy Apostles.


Crafting Fellowship on April 12 and 13

Church of the Holy Apostles Annual Goals and Objectives 2023-2024

Goal 1: Be the active ecumenical leader and partner in our local community.

Look for at least two new opportunities to participate in and host ecumenical gatherings for shared formation (i.e.: JustFaith), worship, and prayer. Gather with as many neighboring churches as possible to participate in each event.

Goal 2: Share who we are and why we love Holy Apostles by increasing internal communications to parishioners and visitors and sharing external communications with the community.

- Beginning in February, designate the first Sunday of each month as "Invite a Friend" day where parishioners invite friends, neighbors and/or family to attend a Sunday service.
- Share a 'Holy Apostles Good News' story written by our Vestry Council and other parishioners on a monthly basis with our community.
- Create a Holy Highlights ministry to feature parishioners and their stories.
- Refine and implement the welcome/greeter ministry to be wholly in place by February.
- Revitalize the newcomer ministry program to be wholly in place by April.
- Work toward building safety and accessibility improvements with a plan in place by July.
- Create an ad-hoc committee in February to reactivate a healing ministry.
- Offer a monthly Caregiver Support Group to the community at large to provide emotional support, reduce social isolation, and be a source of additional resources.
- Create a parishioner survey to present at the annual meeting in September.
- Publicize Holy Apostles events and news via Constant Contact, the ARChive, and new and existing media outlets whenever possible.

Goal 3: Seek available grant money for community assistance, safety doors, and other needs to promote a healthy treasury and community.

- Document existing grant programs used for community assistance
- Seek at least two new programs connected to social justice, community health, safety, and accessibility.

Goal 4: Increase parishioner participation in stewardship activities.

Grow the Stewardship committee from one member to at least two members by March to promote time, talent, and treasure stewardship at Holy Apostles throughout the year.
