A Message from Deacon Gary

Dear Holy Apostles' Friends,

Normally when I write for the ARChive, I focus on the future – what is anticipated in the next month, however, this time I am going to look back at April because it was such a unique, active month.

April started off with Holy Week, the most solemn (and busy) liturgical week of the year. Palm Sunday (4/2) with the blessings of the palms and the procession into church, which adds a sense of solemnity to the ordinary start of our regular Sunday service. Holy Thursday Mass (4/6) was a little shaky, not because of the washing of the feet, but because our presider, Father Mark Wenzinger from St. Gregory's, had a medication reaction and there were times we weren't sure he would make it through the Mass. It was also on this day that our Office Manager Kaleena was admitted to the hospital for observation. As we prayed for her recovery, behind the scenes the staff and volunteers were scrambling as bulletins and binders needed to be assembled for the Easter Vigil and Easter morning services. The afternoon of Good Friday was a beehive of activity to get everything done. The most immediate need was getting bulletins assembled. It turns out that our music minister Cliff (with some help from Bookkeeper Lynne) had some experience with Publisher software, and for the most part, members did not see a significant difference in the output.

The next Tuesday (4/11) was a regularly scheduled Finance Council meeting. The significant topic discussed and recommended for Vestry Council's approval was the resurfacing of the parking lot. This is a large Capital Improvement project which the community has been saving for since the installation of the roof, almost five years ago. Three bids had been provided and a recommendation was made by the Admin Committee which was accepted. The Vestry Council at their meeting on Thursday (4/13) concurred with the Admin Committee's recommendation and accepted Finance Council's input. By Friday (4/28) our parking lot was resurfaced. *Continue to page 11*



Donations, Volunteering and Thanks



Join Plarn each Thursday from 9am to 11 am. Plarn is the process of turning grocery bags into yarn. There are six (6) steps before crocheting may begin. The donated bags are flattened, cut, snapped, tied and then rolled into PLARN balls for crocheting into mats. Each mat takes 500 to 700 plastic bags to complete and is very labor intensive. A total of 20 PLARN mats have been crocheted for sleeping bags and given to People in Need (PiN) for the homeless. PiN values prayer and creative approaches to helping the homeless of Hampton Roads. Church of the Holy Apostles Annual Goals and Objectives 2022-2023

Goal 1: Be the active ecumenical leader and partner in our local community.

Look for at least two new opportunities to participate in and host ecumenical gatherings for shared formation (i.e.: JustFaith), worship, and prayer. Gather with as many neighboring churches as possible to participate in each event.

Goal 2: Share who we are and why we love Holy Apostles by increasing internal communications to parishioners and visitors and sharing external communications with the community.

- Beginning in February, designate the first Sunday of each month as "Invite a Friend" day where parishioners invite friends, neighbors and/or family to attend a Sunday service.
- Share a 'Holy Apostles Good News' story written by our Vestry Council and other parishioners on a monthly basis with our community.
- Create a Holy Highlights ministry to feature parishioners and their stories.
- Refine and implement the welcome/greeter ministry to be wholly in place by February.
- Revitalize the newcomer ministry program to be wholly in place by April.
- Work toward building safety and accessibility improvements with a plan in place by July.
- Create an ad-hoc committee in February to reactivate a healing ministry.
- Offer a monthly Caregiver Support Group to the community at large to provide emotional support, reduce social isolation, and be a source of additional resources.
- Create a parishioner survey to present at the annual meeting in September.
- Publicize Holy Apostles events and news via Constant Contact, the ARChive, and new and existing media outlets whenever possible.

Goal 3: Seek available grant money for community assistance, safety doors, and other needs to promote a healthy treasury and community.

- Document existing grant programs used for community assistance
- Seek at least two new programs connected to social justice, community health, safety, and accessibility.

Goal 4: Increase parishioner participation in stewardship activities.

Grow the Stewardship committee from one member to at least two members by March to promote time, talent, and treasure stewardship at Holy Apostles throughout the year.
