A Message from Father Mario

As some may remember, I took a short-term disability in 2021 due to mental health issues. One of the things I tried to do was find ways to help my spiritual and mental healing. Unfortunately, I could not concentrate enough to read my Theology books for a time. Still, as I started to get better, I began to read again. Eventually, I returned to my copy of a book titled *Life Together* by German pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Bonhoeffer (1906-1945) stands as one of the great saints of the Church in recent memory, a saint who died at the hands of the Nazi government. In 1934, the Confessing Church, to which Bonhoeffer belonged, issued the *Barmen Declaration*, which repudiated the claims of Hitler and upheld the lordship of Christ. As a result, Bonhoeffer's authorization to teach at Berlin University was terminated, and he was later declared a "pacifist and enemy of the State." One of his crimes, it would seem, was forming a community that sought to live out his conception of new monasticism.

As an Evangelical out of the Lutheran tradition in Germany, Bonhoeffer focused on Christians seeking their salvation, deliverance, and justification in Jesus

Christ alone. Yet Bonhoeffer was searching for the joy found when Christians are "together in unity," and he wanted to bring this to not just churches but seminarians. Moreover, he was impressed by the worship centered on the "ordered life" of the communities of monks at Anglican monasteries in England and other forms of communal worship.

In 1935, he accepted an invitation to direct an underground seminary that would recover the rich Christian tradition of the monastics and train a new generation of church

Our new mission is to collect school supplies for children in our community and Virginia Beach Public Schools.


We are coupling with other churches and organizations to collect supplies to be distributed on August 12th at the Virginia Beach Convention Center.



leaders in orthopraxy (right practice) and orthodoxy (right belief). The seminary at Finkenwalde became a social experiment in an intentional Christian community modeled on the Sermon on the Mount.

Alas, the experiment lasted but a moment: the Gestapo, the secret state police, closed the seminary in 1937 and arrested more than two dozen of its students. However, we still have Bonhoeffer's book *Life Together*. When I first read this book as a seminarian, I felt like I was given a window into the lives of fellow students from another era.

Bonhoeffer starts the Community section of *Life Together* with a beautiful and straightforward line from Psalm 133: "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity." Everyone at the seminary would start the day with silence and their version of Morning Prayer (Matins) called *Andacht*. Their daily worship followed a monastic model using the Psalms, with people taking turns reading Scripture to each other and singing hymns together. "It is the voice of the church that is heard in singing together. It is not I who sing, but the church... God's Word, the voice of the church, and our prayer belong together." (page 68)

In the psalms with monks and others, in the Holy Eucharist, in meditation and contemplation done in solitude, and in prayer, I have looked for God. Sometimes I can feel God is there with me. God is there in those moments of song and words, but I also think God is between those spaces between words. During August, what can you do to feel the presence of God in your life?

Church of the Holy Apostles Annual Goals and Objectives 2022-2023

Goal 1: Be the active ecumenical leader and partner in our local community.

Look for at least two new opportunities to participate in and host ecumenical gatherings for shared formation (i.e.: JustFaith), worship, and prayer. Gather with as many neighboring churches as possible to participate in each event.

Goal 2: Share who we are and why we love Holy Apostles by increasing internal communications to parishioners and visitors and sharing external communications with the community.

Beginning in February, designate the first Sunday of each month as "Invite a Friend" day where parishioners invite friends, neighbors and/or family to attend a Sunday service.

Share a 'Holy Apostles Good News' story written by our Vestry Council and other parishioners on a monthly basis with our community.

Create a Holy Highlights ministry to feature parishioners and their stories.

Refine and implement the welcome/greeter ministry to be wholly in place by February.

Revitalize the newcomer ministry program to be wholly in place by April.

Work toward building safety and accessibility improvements with a plan in place by July.

Create an ad-hoc committee in February to reactivate a healing ministry.

Offer a monthly Caregiver Support Group to the community at large to provide emotional support, reduce social isolation, and be a source of additional resources.

Create a parishioner survey to present at the annual meeting in September.

Publicize Holy Apostles events and news via Constant Contact, the ARChive, and new and existing media outlets whenever possible.

Goal 3: Seek available grant money for community assistance, safety doors, and other needs to promote a healthy treasury and community.

Document existing grant programs used for community assistance

Seek at least two new programs connected to social justice, community health, safety, and accessibility.

Goal 4: Increase parishioner participation in stewardship activities.

Grow the Stewardship committee from one member to at least two members by March to promote time, talent, and treasure stewardship at Holy Apostles throughout the year.
