A Message from Fr. Mario

One of my favorite saints is Santa Teresa de Ávila (St. Teresa of Avila). She was born before the Protestant Reformation and died almost 20 years after the closing of the Council of Trent. She would see an age of exploration as well as political, social, and religious upheaval. *Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada* was born in 1515 in Avila in central Spain. She spent her early years with her family, giving herself to the duties of extended family life. Then, at age 21, against her Father's wishes, she professed vows as a Carmelite at the Spanish Convent of the Incarnation in Avila.

St. Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. In an excellent short biography, she is described as "a formidable woman." Her success as an administrator and reformer (she founded 14 monasteries) was partly due to her natural leadership gifts, tenacity in the face of adversity, and sense of humor. Once praying about her many trials and sufferings, she thought she heard God say, "But this is how I treat my friends." Teresa replied, "No wonder you have so few friends." Her writings on prayer and contemplation are drawn from her experience: powerful, practical, and graceful. Her writings, especially the Way of Perfection and The Interior Castle, have helped generations of believers. In 1970, the Roman Catholic Church gave her the title she had long held in the popular mind: Doctor of the Church. She and St. Catherine of Siena were the first women so honored, joining a famous group including St. Augustine of Hippo and St. Thomas Aquinas.

Why am I talking about Santa Teresa? You may even ask, "Father Mario, that's all good, but really, what can a 16th-century Spanish nun say to us today?" I genuinely believe that her teachings and work are relevant today to both Anglicans and Roman Catholics. Consider the following example, from her work *Interior Castle: Considera el alma como si fuera un castillo hecho a partir de un único diamante o de un cristal muy claro en el que hay muchas moradas.* In translation, she describes the soul as a "castle made entirely of diamond or of a very clear crystal, in which there are many rooms." Some are above, some below, some to the sides." She also said that in and in the very center and middle of the castle is "the main dwelling place where the very secret exchanges between God and the soul take place."

Financial Update: March 2022

April 19, 2022

- Overall income is up at this point in the year however the amount going to our regular operating budget for the month was in arrears by \$2400.
- Charlie Mills will assist with the financial audit that will soon take place.
- The RC compensation planning (what the diocese suggest for employee raises) might be later
 this year but hopefully the recommendation will be here in May or early June so Finance Council can formulate a recommendation to the VC.
- Deacon Gary thanks all who helped make Holy Week at Holy Apostles a success.
- Fr. Mario gave the invocation at the city council meeting tonight.
- The ad hoc committee looking at the playground area is still looking for members from the congregation. The ad hoc committee looking at the wall behind the ambo is set. At the next VC meeting the committees will report on their progress and timeline.
- Adult Christian Formation will be the 3rd Sunday in May and then break between June and August and will return in September.
- Testing for mold near the vents will take place over the next 2 weeks.
- HA promotional flyers will be mailed out again in the near future. A suggestion was made that
 in the future, the flyers promote a specific event rather than be general in nature.
- All committee heads should update their goals and wish lists and include dates when items are needed.
- A suggestion was made that when members of HA attend an event as a group, they should wear there burgundy colored shirts, so we stand out.
- Deacon Gary will be on vacation April 20-26.
- The 45th anniversary is only 7 months away. We will need volunteers to make it successful.
- A virtual forum on ecumenical advocacy for the advancement of civil and human rights will be held April 25 – 27, 2022 – the Episcopal website has additional information.
- Thomas Melendez's baptism will be on May 14th at 2 PM with Bishop Susan Hayes presiding.

There is a lot of work to be done for the kingdom of Christ, but few people willing to do the work (<u>Matthew 9:37</u>). Don't be afraid to simply start serving; there is a place for you. Vestry Council 2021-2022 Annual Goals:

Christian Unity Goal:

To investigate and develop a cohesive and ecumenically-focused submission to the Synod of Bishops; to increase understanding of why ecumenism holds special significance for our community; and to become a more visible ecumenical partner in the community.

Objective 1: Create an ad-hoc committee composed of Holy Apostles parishioners that will provide an official submission to the Synod of Bishops call for input.

Responsible Party: All committees, clergy, parishioners

Objective 2: Increase visibility of Church of the Holy Apostles as an ecumenical/interfaith community through active representation, sponsorship, and participation at ecumenical and community activities.

Membership and Outreach Goal:

Continue to communicate Holy Apostles' mission and vision by increasing external exposure of our church to the community through varied media sources and in-person events.

Objective 1: Mail advertising flyers to different local communities to increase awareness of Holy Apostles at least once per quarter.

Responsible parties: Administration - Communications; Christian Unity

Objective 2: Submit a news article to the Catholic Virginian, Episcopal Diocesan Newsletter, and the Virginia Media family of newspapers at least once per quarter. Identify at least one ecumenical outreach event to be offered for coverage by local TV news outlets.

Stewardship/Social Ministry Goal:

Increase parishioner participation in Stewardship activities at Holy Apostles and optimize the Social Ministry funds to maximize output in supporting community assistance opportunities.

Objective 1: Increase level of parishioner participation in at least one Stewardship activity to 75% of active parishioners.

Objective 2: Apply for and submit applications to all eligible/available grant opportunities on time. Optimize the utilization of focused discretionary funds and received grant funding to best support and serve the local community to the maximum extent possible throughout the year.

If this sounds strange to you, you can go to one of my favorite passages from the Gospel of John:

'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?

Santa Teresa lived in "a culture of things heard and seen rather than of things read." In addition, any formal education in Latin was strictly forbidden to women, so when she used scriptural references, it was done from memory. With this in mind, I invite you to join your fellow Christians for Bible Study. We currently have two offerings:

- 1) 10 am Tuesday Morning Bible Study (in person) at our Fellowship Hall.
- 2) 7 pm Wednesday Evening Bible Study (virtual) via Zoom.

I am sure that Santa Teresa would have loved to have this opportunity to study the Bible from a written text and in a group including both women AND men. Sometimes we forget how lucky we are when it comes to the study of Holy Scripture in a group setting. We can follow Jesus' example, directs us in wisdom, creates meaningful connections, provides encouragement, keeps us accountable, and transforms our community. Therefore, I conclude with the following words by Santa Teresa:

"Christ has no body now on earth but yours; no hands but yours; no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ must look out on the world. Yours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which He is to bless His people."
