DEVELOPMENT & PEACE-CARITAS CANADA

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Development & Peace's Share Lent programme: CREATE HOPE - STAND FOR THE LAND – a theme inspired by Pope Francis' words to the delegates at the 4th World Meeting of Popular Movements: "...you have the ability and the courage to create hope where there appears to be only waste and exclusion."

This programme will run from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost Sunday each year for the next 5 years.

The theme harmonizes with Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical Laudato Si'- On Care for Our Common Home, and is a continuation of "land" themes from a succession of D&P campaigns for international justice and respect for Creation: The Earth is for All – Not for Sale! (2000-2003); Water – Life Before Profit(2003-2006); Land & Water (2008-2009); SOW Much Love – To Give (2011).

This Share Lent focus will be on the struggles of small farmers and land protectors in Honduras and Colombia. Information will be available in the Share Lent kit at Mass.

Development & Peace's Prayer of the Faithful for First Sunday of Lent, February 26: For artisans of peace who inspire us to CREATE HOPE AND STAND FOR THE AND alongside our sisters and brothers in the Global Sour whose communities and ancestral lands are threatened by

LAND alongside our sisters and brothers in the Global South whose communities and ancestral lands are threatened by large industrial natural resource developments (mining, clear cutting, dams, agribusiness...) And for those with political power that they serve the helpless, the poor and the common good – We pray....
