#### WHAT IS JUBILEE 2025?

The theme is 'Pilgrims of Hope'. The intention of the year is to offer all of us an opportunity to be "renewed in hope."

"God's word helps us find reasons for that hope.

Taking it as our guide, let us return to the message that the Apostle Paul wished to communicate to the Christians of Rome."

(Bull of Indiction)

This year's Jubilee also seeks to invite practice of patience, "a virtue closely linked to hope ... Patience has been put to flight by frenetic haste, and this has proved detrimental, since it leads to impatience, anxiety and even gratuitous violence, resulting in more unhappiness and self centredness."

In addition, Jubilee 2025 coincides with the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the Synodal conversation of Bishops from which emerged the Nicean Creed and the continued quest "of fitting ways to respond fully to the prayer of Jesus "that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me"

(Jn 17:21).

#### **JUBILEE YEAR**

"The anchor is well-known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon, the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency maneuvers to stabilize the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross." - Bishop Wayne Kirkpatrick
