Be Ambitious for the Higher Gifts

Charisms are graces given to us at Baptism (and Confirmation) so that we can bring the healing presence and love of Jesus Christ to others. Jesus said "Each has his own special gift (charism) from God, one of one kind and one of another" (1 Cor 7:7). "Now there are varieties of gifts but the same spirit... To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, to another the utterance of knowledge" (1 Cor 12:4, 8). Without the charisms we could not speak of the Church as a body because each of us has a unique gift (charism) given to us by God and a mission essential to bringing everyone into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

Everyone has at least one charism and most people have two or more. We experience real joy, a sense of purpose, and a feel as if we've found our place in the world when we exercise our individual charisms. We are more effective and fruitful than we could ever be on our own because of the Holy Spirit having been poured into us. We are called to exercise our charisms at work, with family and friends, in the parish and in the broader community, Charisms generally manifests when we have developed a close relationship with God, often after a spiritual awakening or conversion experience, and when we meet the person who needs the gift because charisms are always for others.

Charisms are not natural talents. They can't be inherited from our parents, although they sometimes work together with your natural gifts. They enable us to be agents of God's mercy, love, beauty, truth, and healing.

In the next few weeks, a summary of various charisms will be presented in the Bulletin for you to reflects upon in order to discern where the Holy Spirit is gracing your life and equipping you for His mission:

Teacher: A person with this charism empowers others to learn information or skills because it will change their lives. They thrive on witnessing the great "Aha!" moment, when the learner grasps the implications of some new knowledge or skill. The information or skill being taught can be religious or secular, and the charisms can be used to teach either individuals or groups. Those with this charism concentrate on two things: (1) the content they wish to teach and (2) how best to get that content across to the person who needs to learn it. Even people, who normally do not like the subject, will suddenly find it surprisingly interesting. Teachers often find themselves making lesson plans in their heads, as soon as they have learned something new themselves. (Possible Expressions of the gift: Public School teachers, religious education, creator of educational curriculum, home-schooling parent).

Hospitality: Empowers someone with this charism to be a generous channel of God's love by warmly welcoming and caring for those (individual and groups) in need of food, shelter, and friendship. A person with this charism may welcome many individuals but they always see you. Hospitality can be exercised whenever people gather and is a very valuable charism for building community. It is beneficial in preparing people to evangelize because it engenders trust, curiosity, and openness.

Leadership: A person with this charism contemplates the world about them asking, "What can we do together to change things for the better?" When a disciple with this gift shares a vison, many find it so compelling that they ant to join the effort to make the vision a reality. They typically found vision centered groups or organizations - St. Ignatius of Loyola gathered six men who became the first Jesuits. (Possible expressions of the gift: Pastor of a mission based church, vision-casting teacher/preacher).
