

#### C.A.R.E. COMMITTEE NEWS

The C.A.R.E. committee is busily preparing documents which will allow us bring a young woman, presently in Pakistan, who escaped the Taliban in Afghanistan. She is in great danger of being deported back to Afghanistan where she will be killed for standing up for human rights and education for women. Her sister is a WUSC student at St. F.X. University. She has been approved for one of the small number of expedited positions for Afghanis, and we hope she will be brought to safety in the next few months. We will keep you informed on our progress in rescuing this young

woman.

#### "THE EUCHARIST IS THE SOURCE AND CENTRE OF OUR FAITH"

"I am the living bread that came down from Heaven, says the Lords. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever." John 6 Did you know? According to a 2019 Pew Research Centre Survey, only about one third of U.S. Catholics believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? Results would likely be similar in Canada. Blessed Carlo Acutis called the Eucharist "his highway to heaven." He died in 2006 at the age of 15 and was beatified in 2020. He had a profound love and devotion for the Holy Eucharist. He is the first Millennial saint and is called the saint of the internet. Carlo spent four years creating a website dedicated to cataloging every

reported Eucharistic Miracle around the world. One of Carlo's quote was, "when we get in front of the sun we get a tan, when we stand before Jesus in the Eucharist we become saints." **Please take a few minutes before or after Mass to read about some of these Eucharistic miracles.**
