CAN YOU HEAR ME?

There have been many concerns and frustrations regarding the sound system. Father Danny learned that when this present system was installed, a delay was added to remove the echo so that the sound people heard at the front was the same sound at the back. During the renovations and art restoration, this unit was damaged and two small speakers at the back of the church had to be disconnected. In speaking with 'sound people' they all seem to agree that our speakers are placed too high. Therefore, new speakers can be ordered and attached to every second pillar at a better height level. THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Bambinelli Sunday – December 17 is a beloved two year tradition at the Cathedral in preparation for Christmas. The Blessing of the Bambinelli was first instituted by St. John Paul II. On the Third Sunday of Advent, the children of Rome are encouraged to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from each of their Nativity sets to St. Peter's Square. Following the Sunday Angelus address, the Pope blesses the figurines. Now celebrated in other churches around the world, this Advent tradition is a way for children and all of us to connect our Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at the Cathedral. At each Mass the Baby Jesus will be blessed.
