EXPLANATION OF SPRINKLING OF HOLY WATER AT BEGINNING OF MASS

During the Easter Season, the Sprinkling of Holy Water will take place at the beginning of Mass. It is a reminder of our baptism and our participation in the risen life of Christ. It is appropriate to remember our baptism during the Easter season when we recall the day of the week when Christ rose from the dead. We will begin the Mass at the door of the Cathedral, and during the opening hymn, the sprinkling will take place combining the entrance procession and the reminder of baptism.

A message from Fr. Danny...

As I reflect on the Gospel message, The Road to Emmaus, I am reminded that Jesus comes to us in community. As a faith community, I thought you would like an update on St. Ninian Place and parish staffing changes.

Ecclesiastical Insurance, a leading insurer of faith communities in Canada, is the insurance broker for the Diocese of Antigonish/St. Ninian Parish Cathedral. The insurance adjuster has reviewed the premises and is preparing the claim for repairs and restoration. We have been advised, by our Diocesan Financial Director (Cathy Farrow) and by the St. Ninian Finance Committee not to proceed with any repairs until the claim is presented by Ecclesiastical Insurance. We thank parishioners for their patience while we wait for the process to unfold. As soon as we receive approval, the work will commence as Jack Sullivan has been preparing for project start-up.

Effective Thursday, April 27, 2023, the parish office will be open from 9am – noon at St. Ninian Place room 018. The parish team including myself and Deacon Henry will be working from room 018 (classroom down the hall from parish office) until the main office is restored. I do try to have Monday as a day off and I do not check or respond to emails on the weekend.

We have been reassigning services previously provided by Paula Kirk to our current staff with the exception of supporting the Cemetery Care Corporation. Paula is available for cemetery inquires by email chancery@dioceseofantigonish.ca or by calling (902) 863-3335.

Leonarda MacNeil, ofs, has agreed to provide accounting (finance) services for the next six months in addition to her work as Director of Religious Education. Leonarda will continue to work from the Chancery Office and SNP Room O18. Leonarda can be reached at finance@saintninian.ca and religioused@saintninian.ca or by calling (902) 863-2338 Emery van de Wiel has agreed to manage the bookings of St Ninian Place as well as coordinate details relating to the repairs and restoration of St. Ninian Place. These are additional responsibilities to his role as Director, Music Ministry and will be in effect for the next six months. If you would like to book space at St. Ninian Place, Emery can assist you.
