EUTHANASIA: WHAT IS WRONG WITH IT?

Wednesday, May 17 at 7pm- Deacon Larry Worthen and Dr. Phillip Cooper

A presentation will be provided on Medical Assistance in Dying by Deacon Larry Worthen. Larry Worthen is a graduate of Dalhousie Law School (1981) and is an ordained deacon in the Catholic Church, appointed to Christ the King Parish, Dartmouth. Dr. Phillip Cooper, is an ordained Priest of the Anglican Church and a Palliative Care Physician at St. Martha's Regional Hospital.
