EXPLANATION OF SPRINKLING OF HOLY WATER AT BEGINNING OF MASS

During the Easter Season, the Sprinkling of Holy Water will take place at the beginning of Mass. It is a reminder of our baptism and our participation in the risen life of Christ. It is appropriate to remember our baptism during the Easter season when we recall the day of the week when Christ rose from the dead. We will begin the Mass at the door of the Cathedral, and during the opening hymn, the sprinkling will take place combining the entrance procession and the reminder of baptism.
