

Why are the donations going to the Foundation and not directly to the Parish?

General donations to the parish at taxed by the Diocese at 13.5%. This tax (levy) is not new, and the annual levied amount is used to fund the Diocese. St. Ninian's levy is approximately \$65,000 per year.

Donations to the Foundation are separate from the Diocese and not subject to the levy.

100% of the donations are held for the purpose of the Cathedral. Donations for the ceiling repair will be held at 100% until the Cathedral needs the funds. Thank you for your donations.

ST. NINIAN CATHEDRAL PLASTER CEILING IN NEED OF REPAIRS

The ceiling in the church is original, constructed of plaster onto wooden laths. Over the many years, the plaster is finally showing its age (150 yrs.) to the extent that some serious remediation work has to be done. An assessment was completed (November 2022) by "Historical Plaster Conservation Services" (Ottawa based company) and they have noted that the bond between the plaster and lath is beginning to fail, which is typical of very old plaster.

Their recommendation is to remediate the ceiling by treating the existing plaster from the top side (or attic), using a water based acrylic polymer that penetrates into the plaster. Basically, it consolidates and strengthens the plaster and its anchorage to the wooden laths. The treatment is spray applied and requires three coats. Scaffolding will be required throughout the area under the high ceiling therefore services in the Cathedral will have to be relocated during this time. We expect this project to take approximately 1 ½ months.

This is a serious problem that will have to be addressed as soon as possible.

To the Foundation

In 2013, a Foundation was established as a separate registered charity. Donations are in support of the Cathedral buildings and parish. Donations cover:

·Expenses such as exterior handrails, flooring, sanctuary rug, etc.
·100% of donations stay with the Foundation (not subject to Diocesan levy).
·Donations are understood to be safe from any future lawsuits.
·Tax receipts are issued for donations.

Message from Fr Danny

On this last Sunday before Lent begins, we are called to conversion. There are 40 days of Lent – meant to lead us to conversion – and turning our lives around. I invite you to take advantage all that is offered during the Lenten journey – the online FORMED, the Lenten booklet – The Path to Hope, and Cathedral Parish Lenten talks.

Unfortunately, this time of year many people are suffering with terrible colds and flu. All we can do to try and prevent getting sick is what our mothers told us – wash your hands!
