Message from Father Danny:

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Sheep, we know, are raised for either meat or wool. They give of themselves to provide warmth and nourishment for others. We, the sheep, are also called to give of ourselves in order to provide shelter and nourishment for others.

Through Baptism we are asked to extend the same love Jesus offers to care for others as our Good Shepherd cares for us. This Sunday is referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday or Vocation Sunday. We are blessed to have two men, from 'The County,' who are responding to the call to priesthood. Deacon David Rankin will be ordained to the priesthood, on May 31, here in the Cathedral. Seminarian Joe MacMaster of Creignish will begin his pastoral year in September within the diocese. We pray for these two men and all who are discerning a call to priesthood or religious life.

Antigonish, as we are well aware, had a rich tapestry of religious presence, and we are so blessed to have the Sister's of St. Martha still giving witness. Reflecting on the past, when we had the CND's and numerous priests, can provide valuable insights into the present and future. As the landscape of the church shifts, it is important to discern where the call to fulfill the mission of the church lies especially with today's challenges and opportunities. Embracing change while staying rooted in the core values of service and compassion can guide us, as sisters and brothers, forward in meaningful ways. This weekend the Scots will mark the Battle of Culloden with an event in Knoydart that began forty-three years ago. The Battle of Culloden changed the course of history for the Scottish people, many of whom arrived on these shores and built the communities and successes we have today. There are at times, especially in winter I wish my people would have hitched a ride with the Scots who left Cape Breton, due to winter, for New Zealand.

With the end of the academic year and convocation a few weeks away we will be saying farewell to students who made Antigonish their home the last number of years. There are students who frequently come to the Cathedral for weekday Mass or for the Sunday morning Mass because of convenience. One such student is Joseph Raaymakers who has been a faithful and active Cathedral member. Joseph came to us from Chatham, Ontario, to play hockey for STFX, where he succeeded as a valuable and award-winning goalie and student. Joseph served us as Lector and with work behind the scenes. After the damage from Fiona he cleaned up my yard and during the big snow storm shoveled off the roof on Margaree St. In the Cathedral every light fixture he cleaned, and every light bulb he changed and the vestry basement was tidied by him on numerous occasions. Joseph's strength (and mine) allowed for several visible changes within the Cathedral. He overcame fear of heights and climbed the extension ladder to hang banners and learned to place his trust in me to hold the ladder and not run off! He truly lives up to his name, Joseph, after St. Joseph the Worker, with his strong character and generous and gentle spirit. Joseph's presence has made an impact not only in the Cathedral Parish but at St.F.X., in town and with our young people. I will truly miss him, not only with labour projects and liturgical suggestions but, as a true friend. As Joseph steps into this new chapter of his life, may he continue to carry
