#### ST. NINIAN CATHEDRAL PLASTER CEILING IN NEED OF REPAIRS

The ceiling in the church is original, constructed of plaster onto wooden laths. Over the many years, the plaster is finally showing its age (150 yrs.) to the extent that some serious remediation work has to be done. An assessment was completed (November 2022) by "Historical Plaster Conservation Services" (Ottawa based

company) and they have noted that the bond between the plaster and lath is beginning to fail, which is typical of very old plaster.

Their recommendation is to remediate the ceiling by treating the existing plaster from the top side (or attic), using a water based acrylic polymer that penetrates into the plaster. Basically, it consolidates and strengthens the

plaster and its anchorage to the wooden laths. The treatment is spray applied and requires three coats. Scaffolding will be required throughout the area under the high ceiling therefore services in the Cathedral will have to be relocated during this time. We expect this

project to take approximately 1 ½ months. This is a serious problem that will have to be addressed as soon as possible.
