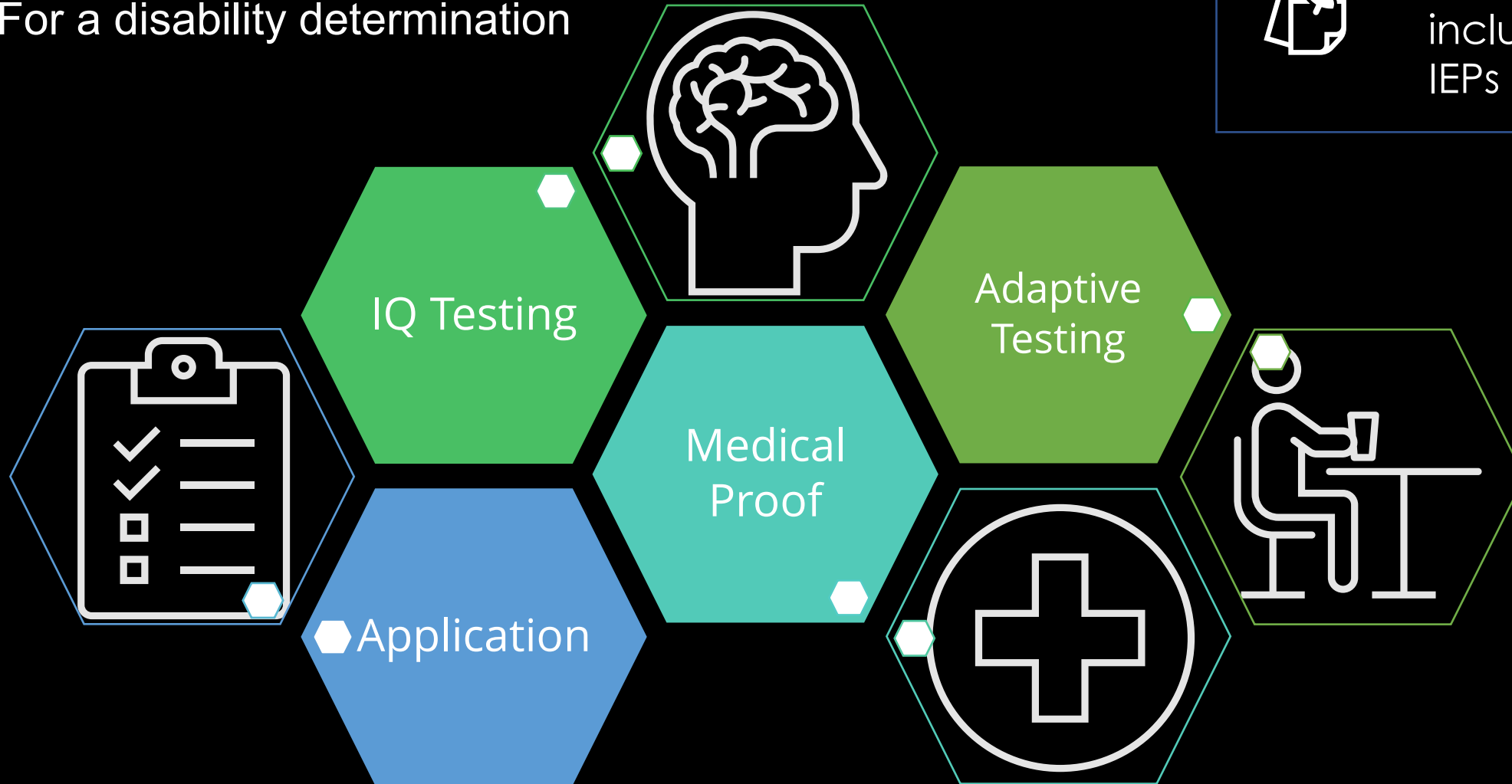
# The Determination Process

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# Documents Needed

For a disability determination



Testing must include signature.  
IEPs accepted.

# IQ Test Score Requirements



## Ages 5-17

One IQ Test after 5<sup>th</sup> birthday

Adaptive test within last 3 years

## Ages 18+

2 IQ tests completed between age 5-17

IQ test after age 18 within 10 years

Adaptive test within last 3 years



Testing below 70 (both IQ & adaptive)

# Testing Accepted – Partial list

## IQ

- Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children – V (WISC-V)
- Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Adults – IV (WAIS-IV)
- Differential Abilities Scale – II (DAS-II)

## Non Verbal IQ

- Universal Non-Verbal Intelligence Test, Second Edition (UNIT 2)
- Wechsler Non-Verbal

## Adaptive

- Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales, Third Edition (Vineland 3)
- Adaptive Behavior Assessment System, Third Edition (ABAS-3)

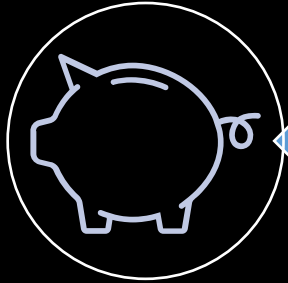

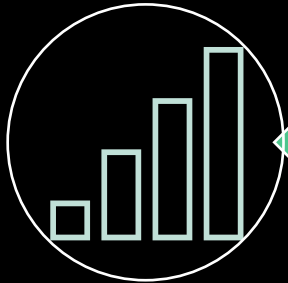

# How do benefits fit in with enrollment?

Individuals will need to apply and have the following benefits in place:

## Medicaid

- Required to apply for Medicaid if this is not currently in place.

## Disability Determination

- Must meet Social Security's disability definition.
- Apply for Social Security Benefits OR by completing a Medicaid Disability application.

## Trusts

- All trusts need to be reviewed by HCPF.
- This can take 3-6+ months to be reviewed.

# Assessments

- Determines functional eligibility
- Done at home
- Looks at skills like eating, dressing, supervision of behaviors, and more.
- SLS - must meet a certain level of care and re-done annually.

- Adult assessment.
- Looks at things like home/community living, employment, health/safety and more.
- Determines level of support.
- Support level determines funding.

SIS



Family and individual voice is important.

Completing the SIS Assessment (benefits must be in place)



While benefits are pending, can discuss services and providers.

# SLS Waiver Enrollment

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- You will work with several Case Managers throughout the enrollment process.
- You will start with an Intake Case Manager.
- Then you will work with an Enrollment Case Manager to choose waiver services and providers.
