

## THE CLOTHES CLOSET

The Clothes Closet was established in 1997 as a project of South Winnipeg Family Information Centre.

The Clothes Closet's mission is to provide quality clothing to women who have financial restrictions and are currently enrolled in a job training program. Clothing is provided, free of charge, to attend a job interview. This is a referral based, by appointment only service. Clients are referred to the Clothes Closet by approximately 65 referring agencies in the City. The Clothes Closet outfits more than 500 women annually.

We gratefully accept donations of good quality women's wear, suitable for the workplace, which is clean and ready-to-wear.

The Clothes Closet operates a sale twice per year (spring and fall). Our sales are open to the public and monies raised go directly to support the needs of the Clothes Closet.
