that our lives may point to you.**

*We give thanks for your generosity.
You may place your offering in the offering plate as you leave our service today.*

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

All thanks and praise are yours at all times and in all places, our true and loving God;
through Jesus Christ, your eternal Word,

...And so as the morning stars sing your praises
we join the heavenly beings and all creation as we shout with joy:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory.

Glory be to you O Lord most high.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

... and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made,
we acclaim you, O Christ:
