CORNNER'S CORNER CAN THE HOLY SPIRIT USE OUR POINTING FINGERS?



This piece is a reflection on how valuable the pointed finger can be to those of us who seek to confess the many ways we "ere and stray" from loving God and loving our neighbors. Our pointed fingers assume a self-righteousness that covers our deep fear of being accused ourselves and prevents us from seeing our own complicity in the ways we are guilty. As it is said: "A good offense is the best defense."

The accusing finger is so powerful anthropologically that we call the process "Satan" which means "the accuser" and the Holy Spirit is called the Paraclete which means "a legal advocate" or "counsel for the defense of the accused". As human beings, we plead in prayer that God does not take the Holy Spirit from us, individually and corporately. While all times are filled with the pointing of fingers, the Holy Spirit continues to be present as an advocate for the accused and as the one who lovingly, if painfully, shows us how our other 3 fingers reveal our fears of being accused and our own sins that are forgivable, if confessed and which are directed to our own soul's redemption.

May we give thanks for the presence of the Holy Spirit in the midst of our fears and finger-pointing. May the Spirit heal us of our fears and gives us the courage to deal with the logs in our own eves.

How will we know when we are able to judge others? How will we know when we have successfully removed that log in our own eyes?

Here is Jesus' word on judging others that would be well worth a prayerful read:

3 Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's[a] eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? 4 Or how can you say to your neighbor,[b] 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' while the log is in your own eye? 5 You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's[c] eye.

God's peace in the fingers we point at ourselves.


