We will hear about it in our epistle lesson from *Revelation* when we celebrate St. Michael's Day on October 3rd—the apocalyptic war in heaven between the angels of light and the angels of darkness.

As Lucifer was expelled from heaven and thrown down to earth, so the tradition sets Michael to stand guard protecting humanity from the Devil's snares and the powers of darkness.

This story gives us a way of visualizing the ongoing struggle between darkness and light in us and in our world. We recognize this ongoing struggle in two of our baptismal vows—

"Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?"

"Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?"

The Bible and our *Book of Common Prayer* give us ways of talking about how we continually stray from God and hurt ourselves and others. They also give us the assurance of God's unfailing love and mercy. We invited again and again to repent and return to the Lord and assured of God's acceptance. And so we are grateful for the powers of light shown to us in the Archangel Michael.
