

MONA Museum


Hobart is home to the Museum of Old and New Art **(MONA**), an internationally renowned museum, with parts of it built into a sandstone cliff and others

Salamanca Markets

Richmond

Mount Wellington

From the summit, you'll discover a beautiful panoramic view of Hobart, the Derwent River, and the surrounding landscapes. The vistas are particularly stunning during sunrise and sunset.

Mount Wellington holds cultural and historical significance for the local Indigenous communities, and there are opportunities to learn about the mountain's rich heritage while visiting.
