Summary of Travel

The research that I presented was on understanding the relation among insurance coverage, race, and breast cancer death. I am planning on developing this research into a manuscript. The abstract is: Relation Between Health Insurance Coverage and Outcomes Among Women With Breast Cancer in Florida.

The manuscript is scheduled to be released June 15, 2015. The research presented at the conference will also be featured in this upcoming book. The title, published by the University of Illinois Press, will be *Civil Rights in the Texas Borderlands* (see: http://go.illinois.edu/s15guzman).

The paper analyzed in detail the manner in which folktales continue this tradition of maintaining the values of the community. In order to prove one's worthiness of being included in the community, the hero is often exiled so that he or she may learn important lessons that are valuable in being a productive member of the society. The conference provided me the opportunity to network with colleagues of similar interests from across the globe.

I presented the finding of my study, IRB Project # 695800-1, at the conference with my colleague, Dr. Karbhari. The report was well received and a lively discussion with other panel members and the audience followed. A paper is being readied for submittal to a journal.

My participation at the roundtable sparked meaningful conversation, but resulted in a confirmed list of junior and senior contributors for our special issue project. Each contributor is a scholar in the field of English Literature, a fact that will make our issue particularly on-point for the College Language Association Journal.

My presentation focused on voiceless expressions and I received positive feedback from the other scholars. I have beer inspired to do some cross-culture women researches, especially comparative studies of women literature between Asian and African-American cultures.

My paper received critical questions and insightful comments and suggestions from the panel chair and other participants including suggestions on journal publication outlets. The discussion session generated ideas which I have integrated in the revision of the paper for publication.

My participation at the conference afforded me a great opportunity to disseminate my current and significant findings with the peers in my area of study. It also afforded me the opportunity to establish collaborations with other scientists and recruitment of prospective graduate students to the university.

The conference theme utilized the metaphor of bridges as a metaphor for the kinds of cultural, musical and interpersonal connections we make across cultures and across generations. My presentation contributed to the conference theme by describing the bridges we cross daily in my music history classroom at FAMU; across hundreds of years; across the color line; and across generations and languages. The most evident benefit of my participation is that ethnomusicologists who teach or research European music learned about FAMU's mission, students, and our new music research initiative.

As a result of my participation in the conference, I was invited to the HBCU Summit in Birmingham, Alabama. In addition, I have worked closely with colleagues at other HBCUs and written an article on HBCUs. Report pending.

Since attending the conference, I have received offers from colleagues to collaborate on various research projects, papers, or books. Also, I plan to collaborate with a colleague, Dr. Anita Bledsoe-Johnson, on a pending reader entitled: "Handbook of Disparate Treatment of Minority Families and Youth: An Interdisciplinary Perspective."

Organized a panel titled "Pan African Culture: Providing a Historical and Contemporary Lens." Along with other FAMU faculty, I will be working with the newly created Virtual Pan African Cultural Heritage Institute as research fellows and members of the Leadership Academy.

The abstract was published in the conference program booklet.

Presented the paper with co-author, Dr. Kelley Bailey, and gained different perspectives from various faculty members regarding faculty recruitment and retention issues in an environment where the shortage of qualified Ph.D. business faculty members is critical.

Understanding specific neighborhood influences on health will enable us to improve the lives of older adults, many of who are aging in place. These results have important implications for researchers who seek to address the growing population of urban older adults.

The paper, co-authored with Dr. Mark Barnes, was accepted to be published electronically. In addition, we were aked to submit a poster. The theme was "Sharing and experiencing the identity of communities through tourism and interpretation."

During the presentation, I analyzed the opinion issued by the Supreme Court of Florida and invited input from attendees. My question is whether Florida's highest court needed to refer the issue to the Florida Legislature. One of the attendees, an expert on issues of admission to practice, agreed that there are questions about whether this was necessary. I continue to research the issue. Attending the workshop and presenting my work helped me to conceptualize

My abstract was published in the Maize Conference Program Booklet. The abstract discuss identifying, developing, and using high micronutrient seed content traits that are of interest for plant biology and human nutrition. Report pending.

A research interest is the relationship between building design and occupant effectiveness, in this particular case, the school building's impact on raising student achievement. Presentation at the conference with this subject matter was unique, as well as, the depth of the quantitative analysis that led to the conclusions. One goal of attending was to reiterate with architects and engineers in the Pacific realm that effective building design and construction correlates to, in my case, desired educational outcomes.

The paper was jointly presented with my co-author. The paper was well received as written and there were no suggestions. The paper has been accepted for publication in the Journal of Finance and Accountancy.

The history and development of downtown Mobile, Alabama, the site of my students' design projects over the better part of five years were subject to analysis based on the above stated ideas (see abstract). The paper includes information about Mobile and selected student design projects.

Gave a presentation and those in attendance were very intrigued and seemingly inspired by our research.

This was a lecture recital, which covered the planning process of a collegiate level vocal recital. The presentation was attended by many high school students, so it was a good recruiting mechanism.

Presented project presentation on "Cognitive Behavior Therapy in Patients with Sickle Cell Disease." Received great feedback and support on study and was able to enlighten others on the seriousness of this issue. Additionally, presentation won 1st prize for presentation presenters!

This paper investigates the linkages across the stock markets of five BRICS countries: Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa. I have applied several updated statistical tests in order to examine the volatility and linkages of these equity markets.
