BETHEL CHURCH NEWS

Bethel Sunday School... Sunday School (now offered for kids in preschool - 4th grades) is set to begin on Sunday, September 14th, in our Sunday School classroom on 2nd floor following worship from 10:30-11:15 am. We will be using our newly purchased Story Bible Holy Moly this year.

Faith Formation Update... We have configured a new format for our faith formation age groupings here at Bethel. Bethel's Sunday School kids (preschool age through 4th grades) will continue to have Sunday School following worship on Sundays. Our confirmation grades will now include 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grades and will continue to meet on Wednesday evenings in Luther Hall. This year, both 5th & 6th graders will receive their student Bibles on Sunday, September 14th.

The following will stay the same:

5th graders will receive their First Communion in the spring of their 5th grade year.

6th graders will begin acolyting and receive training this fall.

Confirmation students will be confirmed in the fall of their 9th grade year.

Bethel Lay Visitation... we have a group of people at Bethel who volunteer to do a once per month visit to elder individuals/couples who seek some additional social interaction in their lives. Mary Bock graciously coordinates the monthly schedule so there is significant flexibility when visits are made, and there is a monthly rotation of who visits whom, meaning lots of different connections are made over the course of some months. COMMUNITY NEWS AND INFO

2025 Willmar Welcoming Week... Saturday, September 13th, 2-6 pm, at the corner of 6th St SW and Litchfield Ave SW in Downtown Willmar. This is an event where new ideas start, friendships are built, and cultures are celebrated. Event highlights include: Taste the World, Experience Willmar's Global Cultures, and Finding Community Resources.

Family Promise of Kandiyohi County... Family Promise (the shelter where families live is in the northern portion of downtown Willmar) exists to serve homeless families in our area and help them stabilize their family, work life, and help them secure housing. Bethel is a sponsor church, and we partner with The Catholic Area Faith Community of Jesus our Living Water to provide a week of food through grocery shopping and providing 3 hot meals every 10-12 weeks. Currently, Family Promise is serving: Family of 3 (Father 34, Daughter 12, Son 9), Family of 3 (Father 48, Mother 38, 4year old), Family of 2 (Husband 26 & Wife 25), Family of 4 (Mother 31, Daughter 10, Daughter 5, Daughter 3), Family of 3 (Mother 34, Son 8, Daughter 2), Family of 3 (Mother 33,Son 15, Daughter 9) Single Female 43.
