	1 Go to the library and check out books about parades, fireworks, picnics, and the Fourth of July!	2 Count all the red, white, or blue houses in your neighborhood. Count the red, white, and blue things in your kitchen.	3 Look for red and blue things in the picture of books you read today. Name them for your child.	4 Celebrate Independence Day! Watch a parade, look for local fireworks or watch them on TV.	5 During end of day toy clean up, have your child look for and show you all the soft things they can find.	6 Make breakfast day together as a family (that includes cleaning up together).
7 Find a simple story or book that your child loves and act it out together! Act like monsters in your kitchen at night, huff and puff and blow things down, climb a beanstalk.	8 Count how many books there are in your house. ____ Which is your child's favorite?	9 Have your child draw a picture of your family. Have them tell you a sentence about the picture. Write it on the bottom.	10 Count how many cans are in your kitchen cabinets. Sort them by size.	11 Play a game outside today with your child. Play another game.	12 Read a book to your child today. Talk about the title. Show them the cover and title page.	13 Take a family bike ride, don't forget water, a snack, and sunscreen! And a book to read in the shade when you get where you are going!
14 Read a book together today and focus on the setting. Can you find a place to go like the one in the story?	15 Encourage your child to dress themselves. Show them how to tie. (Expect tying at 5.)	16 Find a picture book without words. Have your child tell you the story.	17 Say "please" and "thank you". Your child will, too.	18 Count how many windows in your house. ____ Talk about why we need windows.	19 Play a game inside with your child today. Play another game.	20 Have a family picnic at the beach, the park, or even on a blanket in your backyard.
21 Read a book together, focus on the action. Can you act part of the story out? Read a book about pirates and yell "aargh!"	22 Teach your child to say their first and last name. Even if you call your child Fluffy, teach them their given name.	23 Show your child their house number and street sign. Talk about their address.	24 Read a book with your child today. Talk about the author.	25 Encourage your child to dress themselves today. Teach them how to unzip.	26 Count how many trees are on your street or in a park. Hug a tree together!	27 Go to the playground and learn about simple machines! (Check out: <i>-Keep the Learning Going: At the Playground</i>)
28 Read a book together as a family. Focus on building vocabulary!	29 Ask your child to tell you a story. Write it down, add date.	30 Explain why sharing toys with others is important. Practice this skill.	31 Read a book with your child today. Follow the print from left to right with your finger while you read to your child.
