Featured Activity Group - Pickleball



The Shepherd's Center pickleball program, coordinated by volunteers Debbie Basom and Cyndi Ryan, is a popular way for area folks over 55-years-old to stay active and involved socially. Shepherd's Center hosts recreational pickleball on Monday and Wednesday afternoons in local churches. (See the calendar in this newsletter.) Volunteers teach the game on Wednesdays from 1:00 - 3:00 at the First Baptist Church location, where we have four courts and can reserve one court for new players.

A new pickleball player, Betsy Thompson began playing with the Shepherd's Center group last year. Betsy and her husband Bob moved to Topeka two

years ago, to be near family when they retired and she's glad she found this group. "The experienced players have been so friendly and helpful. I remember Dave Mathias loaning me a paddle on my first day. And, Kem Cooper is an especially good and patient training volunteer---I've heard others refer to him as coach."

The number of participants continues to grow and Debbie has made arrangements to add a second location on Wednesdays. Thanks to a Thrivent Financial Community Impact grant and generous donations of time and dollars from volunteers, two more courts at Brookwood Covenant Church will be ready for Shepherd's Center pickleball in early March.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How do I become a member of Shepherd's Center?

Membership is \$30 per year, pre-pay in December or by January 15th (to maximize benefits). The benefits of membership are:

- Reduced fee for Adventures in Learning sessions. (\$25 members; \$30 regular fee)
- Eligible for Travelers field trips, day trips, vacation, depending on registering before filled.
- Inclusion in SCT Membership Directory in next printing. Free directories for members. (\$5 value)

Do I have to be a member to participate in group activities?

Because we are a community ministry, we do not charge for our 8 group activities. Our host does not charge SCT, and we pass it on. However, many people CHOOSE to become members of Shepherd's Center, not just for the benefits, but because they believe in its mission and want to support the ministry.

How much time commitment is there to volunteer?

You can help a little or a lot, as many hands make less work. When you do, you're eligible for the annual volunteer banquet and volunteers get first preference for the annual vacation. All aspects of SCT is run by volunteers whose efforts are coordinated by the Director. If you'd like to help out, just ask.


