

Message from Kathy Harr, Chair

Dr. Elbert Cole had a dream, a vision really, to find a way to promote "a better quality of life by, with, and for older adults." In 1972 he began talking to people beginning with a group of retired parishioners from Kansas City's Central Methodist Church. Apparently, they made it clear that "they had no desire to move into a retirement home the church was planning. They reminded Dr. Cole that in Genesis, God created human life and named his creation "good." God did NOT declare the warranty expired at age 65." (A Proven Experiment: The Shepherd's Center Story, ed. Dr. Rusty Ryan). Every time I read that quote (besides a little laugh out loud) it reminds me not so much of the why I joined Shepherd's Center, but of what it has meant to



my life in retirement. What a blessing it has been to be part of this friendly, caring community with like minded individuals. Those who wish to continue to remain physically and socially active and to keep learning and growing. By coming and participating in Adventures in Learning, activity groups and other events we support each other and contribute to the greater good of our older adult population. As you read this, I hope you will agree that Shepherd's Center Topeka continues to fulfill the tenets of Dr. Cole's dream.

We have been blessed with three visionary leaders over the past 20 years. They have been the "wind beneath the wings" of all the volunteers, speakers, church sponsors, and partners who make SCT a viable entity in our community. Many thanks to Karen Willard for seeing us through the pandemic and working with us to transition the organization afterwards. It has been an interesting journey since 2020. We look forward to our next director seeing us into the future with a commitment to Dr. Cole's ideal of a life well lived in retirement.
