We are grateful for the news media from Channels 12 & 8. They did an outstanding job telling the community about the event. I believe their efforts paid off in the number of people present.

The Disability Expo is moving back to the month of April, and we expect many more vendors will want to participate. In 2019, we had 87 vendors and about 500 individuals that participated in the Expo.
