TFC is designed to serve children who may ordinarily be placed in a residential setting due to treatment needs but who can be maintained in a family like setting or who may have experienced or is at high risk of multiple placements or placement in a more restrictive environment. TFC services are not meant to be long term placement services but shall be provided in a manner table children down to a lesser environment, in a relatively short period of time, when it is in the best interest of the individual. TFC is a specialized program with licensed and certified homes for children with emotional, physical, or behavioral difficulties.
