

REBUILD OPTION OVERVIEW

Rebuild Goals

Church Facility

 Tear down and build new facility on same property

Parish House

- Tear Down
- Repurpose ("merge") with church

Concept to Rebuild

Church	Utilize combined footprint of existing church and portion of hall and land
Facilities	Lower level and portion of upper level – new hall, classrooms, storage, offices, etc.
Property	Revise parish house deed to create easement of existing greenspace for church use
House	Sell parish house (seed money) or continue to rent

New Facility Features

Ecclesiastical Space

250+ seating

Larger Altar

Larger narthex

Private vestment room with bath

Altar boy changing room

Non-ecclesiastical Space

More office space, classrooms

More storage

Lounge/library

Modest increase in function hall space

Facility Features

Some flexibility to change building orientation

Better drainage

Energy efficient

Parish House Options

Maintain and repurpose

1st Floor Offices2nd Floor Meeting RoomsMay require ADA updates

Sell property

All church operations under one roof

Provides "seed money" to fund new church

Easement allows church to continue to use greenspace

Teardown

No net value perceived Not further considered

56-81 56-138 56-142 20,980 Easement 48-81

Parish House Easement

Parish house lot is nonconforming – can't redraw lot

Provides continued use of greenspace if parish house sold

Church would continue to maintain greenspace and stone retaining wall

Timeline, Transition Plan, Estimated Cost

Initial fund raising period of 4-5 years

Will require relocating 12-18 months

\$5.6 million construction cost, all-in

Construction period of 18-24 months

Approximately 7-8 year project

Approximate expansion to +/-12,000 sqft

Rebuild Pros & Cons

Pros

- Maintains existing location
- Replaces aging infrastructure
- Increased church seating capacity
- Larger Altar, more ecclesiastical space
- Improved handicap access
- More storage space
- Better overall flow of space
- Energy efficient, improved drainage

Cons

- Only modest increase in nonecclesiastical space
- No on-site parking
- First Cost more fundraising
- Requires temporary worship space
