Review and consider approval of the sumbission of the following applications for FY22 State Homeland Security Program grant funds through the Office of the Governor.

BACKGROUND:

The State requires that each applicant submit a resolution with the application for funding, signifying that the applicant's governing body approves of the agency applying for the funding and is willing to abide by the grant requirements.

DISCUSSION:

ATCOG will be applying for three projects under the SHSP grant program.

- ATCOG is applying for funding in the amount of \$96,000 for the ATCOG Planning,
 Training, and Exercises project. This project will cover a 12-month period and include
 salary for two positions (Homeland Security Coordinator and Finance Specialist),
 employee benefits, office rent, postage, copying expenses, office telephone, and ATCOG
 indirect expenses, as well as travel for training and State/Regional meetings, and annual
 contracts for regional support (regional mass notification system, WebEOC, and EOC
 support equipment). This project will provide planning, training, and exercise services
 related to the nine-county region's prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and
 recovery from terrorist activities.
- ATCOG will be applying for funding in the amount of \$76,000 for the ATCOG Regional Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Training project. This project will cover a 12-month period. Budget items include \$76,000 in instructor fees to host training for law enforcement officers in the ATCOG region as well as salary and benefits for two positions (Homeland Security Coordinator and Criminal Justice Coordinator). This project will only be funded or partially funded if ATCOG does not meet its LETPA requirement of 25%.
- Lastly, ATCOG is applying for funding in the amount of \$32,747.00 for the ATCOG Cybersecurity Planning and Training project. This project will cover a 12-month period. The budget includes salary for three positions (Homeland Security Coordinator, IT Manager, and Finance Specialist), training, and software licensing. This project is part of the completive national priority categories, and funding. This project is part of the competitive national priority categories.

BACKGROUND:

The State provided regions with estimated allocation amounts as a guide for this year's funding. A funding allocation amount of \$206,000 was used as the estimated allocation amount. ATCOG has submitted roughly \$368,000 in projects. Once the Federal guidance is released from FEMA and the State determines each region's allocation, the State will then review each jurisdiction's project individually and approve or disapprove each one.

DISCUSSION:

The Homeland Security Advisory Committee (HSAC) met on February 17, 2022, and reviewed the 2022 funding requests. The HSAC scored the projects via ballot based on risk, reasonableness, and priority level. The proposed 2022 funding distribution list is being provided at the meeting. The Homeland Security Advisory Committee approved this item on February 17, 2022.

Review and consider approval of the purchase of Q'Straint Inqline Floor Mount Winch Systems for the TRAX and Paris Metro fleets.

BACKGROUND:

5310 funds activities to support providing transportation services to meet the specialized needs of older adults and people with disabilities. Many of our passengers use mobility devices to get around. Unfortunately, most of them are manual wheelchairs which sometimes makes it difficult for our Operators to assist the passenger up and down the ramp. The Inqline system allows the operator to manually guide a mobility passenger in and out of a vehicle with a thumb controller, guiding the device up and down a ramp, even in ideal situations and conditions that can become difficult and dangerous.

DISCUSSION:

The seventeen winches cost a total of \$73,672.56. TXDOT has approved the Transportation Department to purchase this item using 5310 funding along with rural state funding, no cost to ATCOG. If approved by the Board, the purchase will be procured through the State H-GAC Cooperative Purchasing Program Buy Board.

Review and consider approval of the Emergency Call Tracking System (ECaTS) contract renewal for Management Information System (MIS).

BACKGROUND:

The Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC) Program requires that each Regional Planning Commission logs via an MIS system all 9-1-1 call records. ECaTS collects, analyzes, and reports all PSAP's raw Call Detail Record (CDR) data in the ATCOG jurisdiction. Every 9-1-1 trunk is profiled and reported in ECaTS. The purpose of the application is to deliver accurate call volume statistics for all PSAPs in the jurisdiction.

DISCUSSION:

The Management Information System contract renewal with ECaTS costs a total of \$264,190.83 for a 2-year contract term. The costs are based on region-wide MIS service, Text-to-9-1-1 reporting modules, individual PSAP dashboards, and Wireless Routing analysis. ECaTS will be procured through a state contract.

The ATCOG Procurement Policy states that all purchases of \$50,000 and above require ATCOG Board approval.
