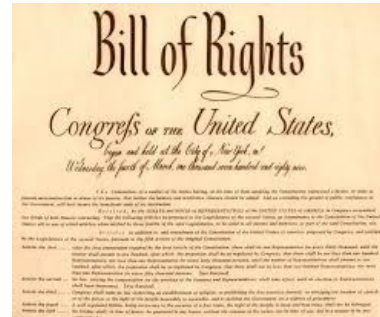

Bill of Rights

- The Bill of Rights are the first 10 amendments of the US Constitution. These amendments guarantee civil rights and liberties to individuals. The amendments also outline and describe the processes for protecting the civil rights and liberties of citizens. At the time of their creation, the Anti-Federalists thought it was important that these rights be explicitly stated.

Bill of Rights

Amendment 1 – The freedom of religion, speech and press.

Amendment 2 – The right to keep and bear arms.

Amendment 3 – Citizens do not have to provide housing for soldiers in time of war or peace.

Amendment 4 – The freedom from unreasonable searches and seizures.

Amendment 5 – Due process is guaranteed. A person can not be punished if they choose silence in a criminal trial. A person may not be prosecuted twice for the same offense.

Amendment 6 – An accused person has the right to a speedy and public trial.

Amendment 7 – A person has the right to a trial by jury in civil cases.

Amendment 8 – The freedom from excessive bail amounts and cruel and unusual punishments.

Amendment 9 – The rights of people are not just the rights listed in the Constitution.

Amendment 10 – There are certain rights and powers reserved by the states.
