She cruised through the IHSGW regional last week, as well, earning five pins. Only Crown Point's Amelia Westfall gave her a serious challenge.

"It was a pretty easy day. My last match (with Westfall) made it to the third period but I was pretty dominant the whole time." Janovsky said of the regional.

Most of this season, Janovsky was No. 1 on IndianaMat's state rankings. That affects the way opponents approach her on the mat. Sometimes, they'll try to lock up early and slow the match's action. Other times, they'll run from her.

"At regionals, no one was really challenging her. That frustrates her and makes her wrestle in a way that she shouldn't. She'll get too aggressive, take a few more chances when she's not scoring," Earry Janovsky said. "My focus with her is to just be patient. The goal is to win the match. It doesn't matter if you pin the girl in 40 seconds or if you theh (fall) them, you've just got to win."

Some wrestlers see Janovsky as a challenge and throw caution away, trying risky shots in unexpected moments.

"It definitely makes me a little (120) more nervous that I'm expected to win," she said, "I'm taking every match like they're going to try something brazy. I've got to be careful and not get impatient and try to pin them right away, just work ray stuff."

That's what she did Friday.

"(A state title) would mean a lot. It's everything I've worked for for pretty much my whole life," Elly Janovsky said before state.

Last month the Lake Superior Court - Juvenile Division submitted an Indiana Department of Corrections (IDOC) Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative (JDAI) Grant Renewal Application to continue this program through June 30, 2024. A County Grant Form is attached for Council review.

Consultant Review

I spoke with the Juvenile Division's JDAI Program Director about this JDAI Grant Renewal Application. The County's JDAI program is an established juvenile justice reform program that is 100% funded by the Indiana Department of Corrections (IDOC). The IDOC notified the Juvenile Division the County's JDAI program is eligible for up to \$55,000 in grant funding for the FY 2023-2024 program year. No local matching funds are required. The JDAI grant will not be used for personnel costs.

The JDAI grant provides alternative programming for juvenile offenders (e.g., creative writing, art, horticulture, tattoo removal, etc.), program supplies, staff training, and travel expenses for JDAI staff at IDOC-required events. This advance grant is accounted for using Fund 391.

Consultant Recommendation

Commissioners and Council Members,

The Voter Verified Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) is a statutorily required piece of election equipment designed to boost voter confidence and allow the implementation of post-election audits. The VVPAT records the voter's ballot on a roll of thermal paper contained within the VVPAT. The unit is placed within the security curtain area of the voting machine. The ballot is visible to the voter through a window. Under original legislation passed in 2019, Indiana counties were required to utilize VVPAT machines with direct record electronic (DRE) voting machines by 2029. Current legislation has expedited the tiered implementation of the program through 2024. Full implementation, required by July 1, 2024, calls for a VVPAT for each DRE voting machine. We currently have 1,304 DRE voting machines. We received 300 VVPATs for participating in a pilot program where they were utilized in early voting. We will need to take possession of the remaining 1,004 pieces throughout 2023. The purchase of the VVPATs are funded by the State of Indiana. However, we lack the necessary storage space required to securely store the voting equipment. Through a collaborative effort, it has been determined a build project to add additional space to the voting machine garage would be the best option. Therefore, we are requesting consideration for funding in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the project.

We thank you for your time and your consideration. We also thank you for joining us in prioritizing election security and integrity in Lake County!

VVPAT

The Voter Verified Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) is a statutorily required piece of election equipment designed to boost voter confidence and allow the implementation of post-election audits. The VVPAT records the voter's ballot on a roll of thermal paper contained within the VVPAT. The unit is placed within the security curtain area of the voting machine. The ballot is visible to the voter through a window. Under original legislation passed in 2019, Indiana counties were required to utilize VVPAT machines with direct record electronic (DRE) voting machines by 2029. Current legislation has expedited the tiered implementation of the program to 2024 and requiring the use of a VVPAT on a minimum ten percent (10%) of the DRE machines in the inventory of the county by July 1, 2022. With a current inventory of 1,304 DRE machines, the VVPAT would need to be deployed on a minimum of 130 voting machines. During the Primary Election of 2022, approximately 60 VVPAT units were utilized during early voting.

Participating in a pilot program, Lake County received 300 VVPAT machines, at no cost to the county. Officials from the Secretary of State's office have advised the remaining VVPAT systems, along with cases which will house both the voting machine and the VVPAT will be provided to the LCBER through the use of HAVA funds and at no cost to the county. A graphic depiction and photograph of the new cases have been attached to this memo. Future shipments (the additional 1,004 VVPATs) are expected throughout 2022 and 2023.

We received positive feedback about the use of the VVPAT machines in terms of the confidence level of the voter that their ballot was cast and counted as it was intended. Negative feedback mostly referred to a concern that others voters could also see through the window of the VVPAT on the machine where they were voting. As the positive feedback points to an increase in voter confidence, the negative feedback appears to be a training opportunity to be certain the machines are set-up in a manner which allows the voter to cast their ballot in privacy.

Post-Election Audits

One of the notable benefits of the VVPAT system is the ability to add an extra layer of security to the electoral process. The introduction of the VVPAT creates a second set of data to allow for comparative analysis with the DRE machine thus increasing the auditability of the election equipment. Pursuant to Ind. Code § 3-12-13-4, a County Election Board may adopt a resolution requesting the Secretary of State designate the county as a risk-limiting audit pilot county.

Director Fajman and Assistant Director Angerman had the opportunity to observe a risk-limiting audit in Allen County on June 22, 2022. VSTOP maintains oversight of the audit process with assistance from the local election office, the Secretary of State's Office, and a

MicroVote representative. Prepared for a two-day process, the Allen County audit was completed in one full day. In demonstration of Lake County's commitment to promoting election integrity and boosting voter confidence, the Director and the Assistant Director are requesting consideration from the Board to pass such a resolution. A template for the resolution is attached.

Agency Impact

Information has been disseminated indicating funding for the VVPATs will be provided through the Office of the Indiana Secretary of State, most likely through the use of HAVA funds, which are dispersed through the U.S. Election Assistance Commission. The funding is expected to cover the additional VVPATs and a case which will hold both the voting machine and the VVPAT. The funding is also expected to cover the cases which will house both the voting machine and the VVPAT for the 300 VVPAT units already received which had a case only for the VVPAT.

The strengths and weaknesses of the impact on the office have been evaluated and the following areas of opportunity and major areas concerns have been identified and are in need of consideration.

Strengths/Opportunities

- Compliance with state laws
- Increase voter confidence

Weaknesses/Areas of Concern

- Increased cost in thermal paper \$8/roll
- Increased cost in freight
- Increased storage for 1300 larger cases
- Complications with heavy equipment – 2 Person set-up and Travel Board

The estimated cost of thermal paper varies greatly depending on voter turnout though an estimate for a lower voter turnout (15%) would be approximately \$10,000 per election or \$20,000 per election cycle with the understanding an increase in voter turnout will significantly increase the expenditure. Each roll of thermal paper is valued at \$8.00 and the total includes one

new roll for each voting machine deployed on election day and two sets for the early voting period. One consideration in regard to the use of paper is whether or not to deploy a VVPAT with less than a full roll of paper on election day. In order to maintain the integrity of the vote and the election materials, it is not advised to change rolls of paper in the field, unless necessary. This would be an larger concern in subsequent elections with partially used rolls of thermal paper, if new rolls are not placed in the VVPATs prior to being deployed.

An increase in freight (professional mover's contract for voting equipment is expected to increase with the increased size and weight of the materials. An estimated cost increase has not been supplied to the office at this time.

With the addition of the larger cases, there is a legitimate and serious concern for storage space. Currently, there is not enough room to adequately store the additional cases. The voting machines (1,304 voting machines in cases) are currently stored on a rack system in the "garage" area. The same space will hold 304 of the new combination cases with voting machines and VVPATs, leaving a need to find storage for an additional 1,000 units. Each case measures 42" x 21.5" x 11.5". The Director and Assistant Director have opened a line of communication with the county commissioners and are discussing storage options.

Weighing in at fifty-two (52) pounds, the new cases to hold the VVPAT and the voting machines, when full, is quite heavy. Set-up will likely require two people. There is an additional concern for travel board workers to carry the required VVPAT to each home or nursing home to for confined voters. Currently, travel board workers, split up the equipment to carry as it is already too heavy. Rolling carts were supplied to travel board workers in a previous election though workers stated they were too cumbersome to carry up staircases and lift into vehicles.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO LAKE COUNTY POLICE RETIREMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, Lake County Police Retirement Plan (hereinafter referred to as "Plan") was established by Lake County Sheriff's Department, Crown Point, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "Employer"), effective as of January 1, 1962; as amended by a complete restatement, effective as of January 1, 2013; and as last amended by a Second Amendment effective as of July 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, by Section 11.01 of the Plan, the Employer reserved the right to amend the Plan with the approval of the Merit Board and the county fiscal body; and

WHEREAS, the Employer desires to amend the Plan in certain respects heretofore considered and discussed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Section 2.01(a) of the Plan is hereby amended in its entirety, effective as of January 1, 2023, to read as follows:

- "(a) 'Actuarial Equivalent' or 'Actuarially Equivalent' means a benefit of equivalent value computed on the basis of mortality determined as follows:
 - (1) For Participants, the Unisex Pension 1984 Mortality Table (UP-1984 Table) with ages set forward one-half (1/2) year. This age adjustment is determined by interpolating (straight line) between mortality rates with no age adjustment and mortality rates with ages set forward one (1) year.
 - (2) For Beneficiaries, the Unisex Pension 1984 Mortality Table (UP-1984 Table) with ages set back three and one-half (3-1/2) years. This setback is determined by interpolating (straight line) between mortality rates with a three (3) year age setback and mortality rates with a four (4) year age setback.

"The mortality basis specified above is to be used in conjunction with an interest rate of six percent (6%) per annum, compounded annually, for the purpose of determining any Actuarially Equivalent benefit, unless otherwise specified.

"For calendar years beginning on and after January 1, 2011, but prior to January 1, 2028, for determining Actuarially Equivalent lump sums, (other than the lump sum payable under Section 8.02(b) or 8.02(c)), the average of the PBGC rates in effect as of the five (5) January 1 dates preceding distribution shall be utilized, provided however, the average rate shall not be less than three percent (3%) and shall not be more than five percent (5%). Such average shall be rounded to the nearest .25%.

I have spoken with Division IV's Drug Court Director and Grant Manager about the proposed PSC Grant Application. This Drug Court was certified by the State last year. Division IV is requesting **\$10,000** in FY 2023 PSC grant funding. **This State grant program does not require any local match**.

The purpose of this letter is to make an urgent request for a special appropriation for a Commissioner, and support staff for that judicial position in the Lake Superior Court, Criminal Division.

The Criminal Division has been operating with four judges and two magistrates for the last 27.5 years. The filings of new cases have been steadily increasing over the last 5 years, and based on legislation that became effective in July 2022, as referenced below, it is anticipated that the influx of expungement cases will significantly add to that increase.

New criminal cases filed have increased from 3,722 in 2019 to 4,038 in 2022. This increase in the initiation of cases has a "trickle down" effect, as well. For example, probation revocation petitions have increased during that same time period from 1,321 in 2019 to 1,498 in 2022. Additionally, there are similar increases in petitions to expel from Community Corrections, and post-sentence collateral attacks. The filings of Petitions to Expunge Convictions (XP cause numbers) were added to the caseload in July of 2015, and number of filings has increased 45% from 2019 through the end of 2022.

Most alarmingly, and what has prompted this emergency request, is the amendment to I.C. 35-38-9-19(c). This amendment requires the State to request the expungement of all records of arrest that did not result in the filing of criminal charges, within 180 days of that arrest. Since the effective date of the statute was July 1, 2022, it is anticipated that these expungement petitions will begin to be filed starting on January 3, 2023. The Lake County Prosecutor's Office has informed the Court that at least 3,000 people have been arrested since July 1, 2022 by Lake County police departments, excluding arrests make by the Lake County Sheriff's Department, the Gary Police Department and the Hammond Police department. Therefore, the number will be significantly higher. While the need for an additional judicial officer in the Criminal Division has been growing, this legislation has certainly become the tipping point.

The Magistrates have their own individual court dockets, with regularly scheduled hearings. In addition, one Magistrate is scheduled to work a half-day each weekend and holiday to review new charges presented by the Lake County Prosecutor's Office. The time necessary for the Magistrates to handle their duties and responsibilities already far exceeds forty (40) hours a week.



Further our Division's newest problem-solving court, Drug Court, which is now up and running, and our other problem-solving courts, Re-entry Court and Mental Health Court, provide a tremendous benefit to our communities, but add significantly to the workload of the Division. Based on that workload, and the increasing number of case filings, the additional extremely onerous burden of this new legislation, compels us to respectfully request the immediate creation of and funding for the position of Commissioner for our Division, with a bailiff and secretary as support staff.



ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LAKE COUNTY RECORDER'S ENHANCED ACCESS FUND, A NON-REVERTING FUND

- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-3.5-5, the County Council shall adopt ordinances to promote efficient County Government; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the County Council shall appropriate money to be paid out of the County Treasury, and money may be paid from the County Treasury only under appropriation made by the County Council, except as otherwise provided as law; and
- WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish by ordinance all funds within the County Treasury, from which appropriations and transfers require County Council approval; and
- WHEREAS, under the authority provided by I.C. 5-14-3-3.6(c)(2) the Lake County Recorder and Lake County Commissioners have entered into a contract with a third party to provide enhanced access to recorded document index information and to recorded document images that are public records on file and under the legal authority of said Recorder; and
- WHEREAS, I.C. 5-14-3-3.6(e) and I.C. 5-14-3-8(h) permit the assessment of a reasonable fee for the provision of such enhanced access to public records; and
- WHEREAS, I.C. 5-14-3-8.3 requires the County fiscal body to adopt an ordinance to establish an Enhanced Access Fund into which the enhanced access fees received by the Recorder shall be deposited.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED as follows:

- 1. That the Lake County Recorder's Enhanced Access Fund, a non-reverting fund is hereby established to receive those fees received by the Recorder for the above-described provisions of enhanced public access to public records under said Recorder's charge.*
- 2. That the Fund shall be a dedicated Fund and the monies deposited therein shall be used (i) for the replacement, improvement, and expansion of capital expenditures in the Lake County Recorder's Office, and/or (ii) for the reimbursement of operating expenses incurred in providing enhanced access to public information by the Lake County Recorder's Office.
- 3. That pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the Lake County fiscal body shall appropriate all money to be paid out of the Fund, except as otherwise provided by law.

4. Any money remaining in the Fund at the end of the year shall not revert to any other fund but continues in the Lake County Recorder's Enhanced Access Fund.

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LAKE COUNTY RECORDER'S ENHANCED ACCESS FUND, A NON-REVERTING FUND

- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-3.5-5, the County Council shall adopt ordinances to promote efficient County Government; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the County Council shall appropriate money to be paid out of the County Treasury, and money may be paid from the County Treasury only under appropriation made by the County Council, except as otherwise provided as law; and
- WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish by ordinance all funds within the County Treasury, from which appropriations and transfers require County Council approval; and
- WHEREAS, under the authority provided by I.C. 5-14-3-3.6(c)(2) the Lake County Recorder and Lake County Commissioners have entered into a contract with a third party to provide enhanced access to recorded document index information and to recorded document images that are public records on file and under the legal authority of said Recorder; and
- WHEREAS, I.C. 5-14-3-3.6(e) and I.C. 5-14-3-8(h) permit the assessment of a reasonable fee for the provision of such enhanced access to public records; and
- WHEREAS, I.C. 5-14-3-8.3 requires the County fiscal body to adopt an ordinance to establish an Enhanced Access Fund into which the enhanced access fees received by the Recorder shall be deposited.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED as follows:

- 1. That the Lake County Recorder's Enhanced Access Fund, a non-reverting fund is hereby established to receive those fees received by the Recorder for the above-described provisions of enhanced public access to public records under said Recorder's charge.

That the Fund shall be a dedicated Fund and the monies deposited therein shall be used (i) for the replacement, improvement, and expansion of capital expenditures in the Lake County Recorder's Office, and/or (ii) for the reimbursement of operating expenses incurred in providing enhanced access to public information by the Lake County Recorder's Office.
- 3. That pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the Lake County fiscal body shall appropriate all money to be paid out of the Fund, except as otherwise provided by law.
- 4. Any money remaining in the Fund at the end of the year shall not revert to any other fund but continues in the Lake County Recorder's Enhanced Access Fund.

The Indiana Supreme Court recently awarded the Franciscan Health Foundation a \$75,000 grant to administer Lake County's Volunteer Advocate for Seniors and Incapacitated Adults (VASIA) program. Lake Superior Court - Civil Division Room 7 serves as the Local Administrator for this grant because the Indiana Supreme Court requires VASIA grant recipients to collaborate with County Probate Courts. The Civil Division Room 7 provided the attached Council Grant Form to participate in the VASIA grant as its local administrator.

Consultant Review

I have spoken with the Civil Division Room 7 Court Administrator about this grant and reviewed the FY 2023 VASIA Grant Award documents. The Indiana Supreme Court has provided VASIA Grant funding to operate a Lake County VASIA program for several years. The Franciscan Health Foundation prepared the VASIA Grant Application, developed the grant project budget, and will provide all VASIA grant-funded services.

The Indiana Supreme Court advances the Franciscan Health Foundation's **\$75,000** grant award to the Lake Superior Court - Civil Division. 


