Le discours haineux du ministre de la Justice de la RDC suscite une condamnation internationale

Goma, DRC - A recent hate speech by the Democratic Republic of Congo's Justice Minister, C. Mutamba, has ignited widespread condemnation, both domestically and internationally. The minister's inflammatory remarks, made at Munzenze Prison in Goma, incited inmates to denounce and potentially harm fellow inmates of Kinyarwanda-speaking origin, labeling them as "collaborators of Rwanda."

This alarming incident has drawn parallels to the historical persecution of the Tutsi community in the region, particularly in North Kivu. Experts and activists gathered at the recent FCDC Space event on X (formerly Twitter) to discuss the systemic discrimination faced by Congolese Tutsis over decades.

Panelists, including renowned journalists, human rights activists, and political analysts, emphasized the urgency of addressing this issue.

They highlighted the various forms of persecution, ranging from questions about their nationality to social exclusion. The minister's hate speech, they argued, is a clear indication of the government's complicity in the ongoing persecution of the Tutsi community.

In response to this grave situation, a global call has been issued to:

Publicly denounce the Justice Minister's hate speech and impose appropriate sanctions. Implement measures to protect the rights and safety of all inmates, especially those of Kinyarwanda-speaking origin. Promote dialogue and understanding among different ethnic groups in the DRC. Investigate any acts of violence or discrimination stemming from the minister's speech.

The international community is urged to take immediate action to prevent further escalation of violence and ensure the protection of vulnerable communities in the DRC.
